DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Deberry House is located east off U. S. Route 219S, about two and one-half miles northeast of Oakland. The house is positioned far from the road on a dirt farm road and is surrounded by meadows.

The house is a two-story, gable-roofed dwelling with a three-bay, center-door facade. The facade points east and the scar of a one-story porch is visible on the facade. A two-story, shed-roofed addition is attached to the west elevation.

The house rests on a stone foundation and is covered by weatherboarding. The windows are two over two sash and have plain board surrounds. The roof is covered with diamond-shaped asphalt shingles. The facade door is offset to the north. The house has two stove chimneys: one interior cinderblock chimney at the center of the main block and one exterior chimney on the west elevation of the addition.

The interior arrangement of the house is unknown. The site includes several frame outbuildings.


