## DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The James White House is located on the N side of MD Rt. 560, about one and a half miles east of Loch Lynn. The house is set back from the road and overlooks a valley. The house is surrounded by fields.

The house is a two-story, gable-roofed log dwelling. The south and east elevations are covered with one-story, shed-roofed additions, and the entrance to the house is on the east elevation.

The house rests on a stone foundation which has been faced on the N gable end with cinderblock and on the west with brick. The walls are constructed of logs, covered with brown brick-patterned asphalt roll siding. The windows are two over two sash with plain board surrounds.

The roof is covered with tar paper. At the S gable end of the main block is a large interior fireplace chimney, constructed of squared stones with a corbelled cap. A cinderblock and brick stove chimney extends from the roof of the one-story addition on the S gable end.


