The Clendening House is a frame, two story, T-plan with its facade located on the gable end of the T extension (east elevation). This gable end has a symmetrical three bay, center door arrangement with an unfenestrated second floor, center bay. The east elevation of the crosswise block has a door on either side of this front extension so that each of the three rooms on the first floor has its own exterior entrance. All windows are two over two sash with plain board surrounds. Each of the three gables is pierced by a small diamond-shaped window. A shed-roofed porch supported by turned posts with simple brackets extends around all three sides of the front extension.

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Clendening House is located on the west side of Bethlehem Road where it joins Schell Road at Tasker Corners.

The house is a frame, two story, T-plan with its facade located on the gable end of the T extension (east elevation). This gable end has a symmetrical three bay, center door arrangement with an unfenestrated second floor, center bay. The east elevation of the crosswise block has a door on either side of this front extension so that each of the three rooms on the first floor has its own exterior entrance. The doors are raised, four-panel doors with transom lights, however, the top two panels in each door have been replaced with glass panes. All windows are two over two sash with plain board surrounds except for a single two-pane casement window on the first floor, north elevation. Also, each of the three gables is pierced by a small diamond-shaped window. A shed-roofed porch supported by turned posts with simple brackets extends around all three sides of the front extension. The one story shed-roofed addition across the rear of the house (west elevation) was constructed in 1964 to provide space for a bathroom. The exterior walls are sheathed with aluminum siding and the roof has a covering of asphalt shingles.

The interior is divided into a three room plan. The front room, which occupies the whole facade extension, has a fireplace located on the partition wall. The crosswise block of the building is separated into two rooms. The southern room contains the stairway which rises from the southwest corner along the west wall. The northern room is used for a kitchen.

A shed-roofed privy with weatherboard siding is located north of the house.


