A small farm typical of this area, the Joe King Farm consists of a dwelling, a shed, and a frame bank barn. The dwelling is a frame, two story, gable roofed building on a coursed stone foundation. Its basic configuration is an ell-plan that was constructed in two parts. The 3 bay by 1 bay main block with full length facade porch is the original structure; the rear wing, which has a two story bay window on its southwest side, is a later addition. Both sections are covered with German siding and lit by 2/2 sash windows. The wood shed and ice house that would complete the farm have been torn down.

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Joe King Farm is located on the east side of Lemoyne King Road approximately .6 mile south of its junction with White Church-Steyer Road. The site includes a dwelling, a shed, and a barn.

The house is a frame, two story, gable-roofed building on a coursed stone foundation. Its basic configuration is an ell plan that was constructed in two parts. The 3 bay 1 bay main block with full length facade porch is the original structure; the rear wing, which has a two story bay window on its southwest side, is a later addition. A rear porch, now partially enclosed, extends across the southeast side of the main block and continues along the northeast side of the rear wing. A bathroom in the form of a one room shed-roofed wing was later added to the northeast side of the rear wing at the second floor level. The facade has a symmetrical three bay, center door arrangement with a transom-topped door. Two over two sash windows with plain board surrounds and simple drip moldings light both wings. The bay window, however, has paired one over one sash on its main face and single one over one sash on its side faces. A circular window pierces the gable of the bay window, while small rectangular ones are placed in the gables of the main and rear wings. German siding with cornerboards covers the exterior walls of the house. A layer of "random ashlar" asphalt siding covers the southwest and southeast elevations of the rear wing. The roof is clad with corrugated metal and has exposed rafter ends. An interior concrete block chimney is located on the ridgeline of the rear wing.

The interior is arranged in a center hall plan. The stairway is an oak, 15 tread, straight run with turned balusters spaced 2 per tread. The newel post is square with bullseye blocks near the top. The interior doors are raised four-panel doors with a grained finish. Door and window surrounds are flat board with a bead on the inner edges. The bathroom is equipped with a wooden bathtub that has a metal lining and folds down from the wall.

A frame shed on a stone foundation sits just north of the house. To the south is a frame bank barn with several shed additions. The present occupants of this site reported that an ice house and a wood shed were torn down.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

This frame, three bay by one bay, gable-roofed structure is a house type common to western Maryland from the late nineteenth through the early twentieth centuries.

The main block of this house was already on the property when Joe King moved here in 1896. It was he who had the rear wing added¹. The house, barn, and the wood shed and ice house that were torn down, comprise a small working farm that is typical of the Gorman area.


