DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (if known) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

Located at 22 South Second Street in Oakland, Garrett County, the building stands on the east side of the street between Green and Center Streets.

The building is a 1940 one story brick structure that consists of a central squarish block with matching flanking wings. The roofs are hip with a closed polygonal cupola centered on the main portion. The principal facade (west side) has three bays the full height of the main portion with a doorway surmounted by a base relief eagle and windows above and in the side bays. The bricks are laid in Common bond (5 stretcher-1 header). The roof is covered with metal sheets. Marble is used throughout the interior. The building is structurally sound.

| STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE <p>The cornerstone of the Oakland Post Office indicates that the building was erected in 1940 while James A. Farley was Postmaster General, John M. Carmody was Federal Works Commissioner, and W. Englebert Reynolds was Commissioner of Public Buildings. Louis A. Simon was Supervising Architect and Neal A. Melick was Supervising Engineer. Architecturally, the post office is typical of the classically inspired buildings erected by the Federal government in the Depression Era.</p> | | | | | | | |




