The main house at Oakington is in three parts.
 The central portion of Oakington is a two and one half story late Georgian or Federal style stone house built around 1810. It is three bays long and three bays wide under a hipped roof with two large central chimneys with captain's watch between. There is a dormer on three hips. The north central entrance has a large semi-circular leaded glass fanlight, sidelights and double doors under a portico. Above the windows are flat arches of stone, the sash are 6/6 and the shutters are paneled on the first floor andouvered on the second floor. The center second floor window on south facade is a double windows with 4/4 sash in each. ^{DN, t} The east side of the building is an eight bay, two story addition repeating the architecture of the old block and on the west is a two story frame wing with "A" roof designed by Stanford White in 1900, six bays long with
