Morgan's Lott is a large, stuccoed, stone house consisting of three units. The center section of the house appears to be the oldest. It is two stories high and has a steep pitched roof covered with wood shingles.

Restored in 1968 by its previous owners, this house has a long history. It gets its name from the first assignee, William Morgan, who gained control of the property in 1687. Thomas Bond acquired it in 1729, and in 1774 it was sold to Robert Conn. The Griffith map of 1794 shows it as "Conn's".

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This large, stuccoed stone house consists of three main parts. The house is set back off the road and is perpendicular to it. Its formal entrance is on the northwest while the entrances most commonly used are on the southeast.

The center section appears to be this house's oldest. It is two stories high with a steep pitched, gable flank roof covered with wood shingles. The roof has a box cornice. A large stone chimney is located at each end, the southwest chimney protrudes from the wall while the chimney at the opposite end is flush. This section is three bays long and has a center entrance located on the southeast. There are no entrance on the northwest. Windows in this section are six lights over six. They are pegged and mitred with beaded trim. Foundations of unstuccoed rubblestone form a semi-subterranean cellar. An entrance is under the porch of this section in the center bay.

Inside this section is two rooms wide, one room deep. The original stairway was located in the west corner. It is a winding stairway and is situated next to the southwest fireplace. This large, stone fireplace, was used for cooking. There is no crane in the fireplace it has holes on the sides for putting fresh tree limbs through to hold cooking equipment. Ceiling beams in this section are beaded, as are the chair rails and baseboard on the second floor.

The southwest section of this house is also a two story, stuccoed rubblestone structure. A corbeled brick chimney is located on the southwest inside gable end of the wood shingled roof. This unit has a classic side through hall layout with the principal entrance facing northwest. This door has a four light transom. The double doors are four moulded panels each. They have brass knobs. A one bay, gable front entrance porch shields this doorway. This section also has a semi-subterranean cellar beneath it. This has a separate entrance under the porch on the southeast facade. Windows in this section are also 6/6, pegged and mitred.

Inside this section has a through hall with one large room to the southwest of the hall. The stairway is open with one landing. A fireplace is located on the southwest wall.

A one story, shed roofed porch runs the length of the southwest and middle unit's southeastern facade. The porch has chamfered posts which are exact copies of the originals.

The northeast unit of this house is one and one half stories high, having two gable front dormers on the southeast side of the wood shingled roof. Windows in the dormers are three lights over six. A corbeled brick chimney is located at this section's northeast inside gable end. Windows on this section's first elevation are 6/6. Arrangements of windows and doors on this unit's southeast facade are: W W D W. The door is paneled and has an old iron latch. A small addition on the northwest is one story high-the roof of the northwest unit extends to cover this addition. A tall, brick chimney flue rises from this addition.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

Restored in 1968 by the previous owners, this comfortable, unpretentious farm house of stuccoed field stone has a long and interesting history. It is located on 4 acres, a part of Morgan's Lott originally consisting of 200 acres. Assigned to William Morgan in 1687 it was a part of a 4000 acre Grant to Richard Board. Acquired by Thomas Bond in 1729 followed by his son, John, it was sold to Robert Conn in 1774. The Griffith Map of 1794 shows it as "Conn's". When Mr. Conn conveyed it in 1795 it was either purchased or leased for a number of years by Frenchmen, Veterans of the American Revolution. In 1804 it was purchased by Francis Delaporte who had inherited Bon Air from his brother.

Then followed a period of ownership by Quaker families-first by John Jewett Jr. and then by Charles Hoopes of Chester Co. Pennsylvania. It was at this time the farm was referred to in the records as "Walnut Grove". In 1870 when George H. and Mary J. Zimmerman of Baltimore bought the property at a Trustees Sale The Sun Paper of February 1, 1871 described the improvements as "a substantial Stone Dwelling House containing on the first floor, Hall, Parlor, Dining Room, Sitting Room, Pantry and Kitchen: on the second floor are eight Chambers and Bath-room. In front and around the House is a Piazza 60 feet in length. . . a daily stage passes the door. . . there is an excellent pump in the kitchen and one at the barn. . ."

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (If known) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

Three-part stone structure have been added to at several periods. Facing east, ridge line n-s.

The central section has a roofline steeper than either end, two windows and a door on the one-story porch downstairs, two windows upstairs, six over six. Two of the four chimneys rise from the ends of this part of the house. *a small attic window has been bricked over; was tactfully replaced, 2 1/2 lights.*

The north end of the house is one and a half stories with peaked gable windows on the east side of the roof. Three windows and a door come out onto the east porch, a lower floor than the ~~middle~~ porch. A lean-to at the west side of this part is a utility area; this section is a kitchen and family living area.

The south section of the house is two full stories, with three windows upstairs and two windows and a door downstairs. The two-story porch ^{on the east side} is enclosed upstairs. ~~unenclosed~~

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE (Include Personages, Dates, Events, Etc.)

The central section has been dated by ^{architect} James
 Bolton as about 1750, perhaps earlier. The
 first known owner, Peter Bond, died here ^{in 1738} or perhaps
 in an earlier log house located where the north
 end of the house stands. The north section
 is the next oldest, with the possibility that
 the large (cooking) fireplace may date from a previous
 structure. Probable date, 1780-90. The south
 section appears to date from about 1830.
