This long store front and apartment building is a good example of how vernacular buildings have constantly changed over the years. Known in the mid-19th century as the Jarrett Buildings after their builder, A. Lingan Jarrett, Clerk of Court from 1851 to 1858, the structure was originally two separate buildings. Several stores and law offices occupied the buildings. By 1880 the center portion was built giving the building a center bracketed gable leading to the original buildings which had modillioned cornices. J. G. Rouse's store occupied one store, E. W. Baker's Drug Store occupied the other, and there were law offices upstairs. The building is also remembered as the site of J. Woodley Richardson's store in the 20th century.

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This seven bay store front with apartments upstairs is at 109 - 115 South Main Street in the Town of Bel Air, Harford County, Maryland. It is sided in asphalt shingles. The earliest part of the building has a gable roof (one bay wide on the sides) and the subsequent additions to the rear have a slightly sloping flat roof. The building has three single story store fronts topped by a balustrade edged porch. The second story is set back c. ten feet. While the building has irregular fenestration, the majority of the windows are 6/6 double hung sash set in square surrounds painted a color darker than the shingle. The north store front (formerly two) is occupied by the Draft Board, a bar-restaurant. This part is paneled and shows two center doors flanked by two show windows which have stained glass panels hanging in them. The next two stores are the Tobacco Pouch and the Legal Clinic. These stores have conventional plate glass windows flanking the recessed entrances.

The rear (east) elevation shows the irregularity of a building that "just grew." At the north end is a portion that projects one bay farther to the east than the rest of the structure. A second story wooden gallery runs along the center bays supported by plain posts. The south bay has cement steps rising perpendicular to an entrance.

The building has clearly been changed and added to several times in its history.

### STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

This long store front and apartment building is a good example of how vernacular buildings have constantly changed over the years. Known in the mid-nineteenth century as the Jarrett Buildings from their builder and first owner, Capt. A. Lingan Jarrett, Clerk of Court from 1851 to 1858, the structure was first two buildings with the center part not built. As early as 1850 the Harford Gazette mentions the two buildings. On the 1858 map the northern one is identified as Moore's Store and "the offices of Jarrett Webster, Archer, and Dallam;" the southern building contained the Odd Fellows Hall and the offices of H. W. Archer and William H. Dallam. In 1867 the store in the north building was known as Moore and Morris; the following year Jarrett sold "the property whereon the Jarrett Buildings now stand" to Benjamin P. Moore (1868, 20/257) whose store already occupied the north building. In 1875 Moore, by that time living in Baltimore City, sold it to Charles W. Norris and Frank C. Norris for \$5000 (31/252). The center store was built sometime between this transaction and January 1880 because on January 9, 1880, the property was advertized as an "improved two-story frame building commonly known as the Jarrett Buildings;" the stores occupying it were J. G. Rouse's (he bought the Norris store in 1878 - at least the lease) and E. W. Baker's Drug Store. Also in the structure were three double offices and a large hall - the Odd Fellows Hall of 1850. In 1881 John G. Rouse purchased the building for \$4750 from George L. Van Bibber (42/159). Van Bibber was trustee for the sale after a lawsuit (Armstrong Cator vs. Charles W. Norris et al). Frank Norris, Charles' partner had purchased it privately for \$4500 and joined Van Bibber in giving title. The 1904 insurance map shows a building with the center bays open in the first story with a two story portion in the north part of the rear. The central and south portions of the rear are still one story. John Rouse continued to run his store there until 1909 when he sold most of his holdings including the house at Gordon and Bond to William C. Rouse, his son, for \$23,000, (127/232). The following year William sold the Eagle Hotel and the Main Street store back to his mother, (132/2). In 1919 Hattie B. Rouse, then a widow living in Baltimore City, sold the store to J. Woodley Richardson for \$7000 (162/328). Richardson had the store by that time. Richardson's widow, Isabel, sold it to Frank Jacobs in 1941 (269/316) and Jacobs sold it back the same day to Isabel Richardson and Matilda Price (269/317). They sold it to the Chinaris, Charas, and Papachrists in 1943 (278/421) where most of it remains today.


