The McCann House is a good example of a vernacular house which received an early attempt at updating or stylizing, probably in the 1890's. The crossroads near the house was apparently known as Muttonsburg in the second half of the 19th century and came to be called McCann's Corner in the late 1890's.

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The McCann House is a two-story frame house with a central gable and shed porch built about 1880 and located on the east side of Forge Hill Road just south of the intersection of Trappe Road at McCann's Corner in the vicinity of Dublin, Harford County, Maryland. The main elevation faces northwest toward Forge Hill Road.

The house is set back from the road about 30 feet. The main facade has three bays and a center entrance, emphasized by the center gable. In the gable peak is a 6/6 window with a round arched top. The porch has chamfered posts and a gabled entry canopy. The canopy is supported by oversized brackets with a scroll-sawn duckling's head motif.

At the rear of the house is a two-story ell with an open two story porch on its east end. A formerly open porch on the rear of the house is now enclosed and has a plate glass door.

The foundation is stone and the original clapboard siding has been covered with white aluminum siding. The slate roof has a decorative pattern. Interior brick chimneys project from each gable end.

The current owner retains a late 19th century photograph of the house, showing that the original exterior siding was a darker color and the porch had plain brackets and no entry roof. The slate roof was originally unpatterned.

About 40 feet east of the house is a two story frame smokehouse. The exterior has german siding and a shingled gable. The roof is slate and originally had a central brick chimney stack.

South of the house is a group of several frame barns, sheds, or other outbuildings. Most have stone foundations and vertical siding. Several additions have been made, probably in the early 20th century.

The 1878 Martenet map does not show this house, but William McCann apparently owned land in the northeast quadrant of the crossroads.

Note: Survey number HA-317 was originally assigned to the Archer Price Stone Wall. Information on this structure has been consolidated with HA-316, Judge John H. Price House.


