The building appears to retain its original colors including red, green and grey trim.

## DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

618/620 Fountain St. is a two and a half story four bay wide apartment house with a three bay circular tower at each end. A frame two story wing, covered with shingles, is on the rear. The apartments are one of five such units built by the Burns brothers in the early twentieth century, all of them covered with form stone. This building is in excellent condition on the exterior; the form stone is brownish grey and the trim-perhaps the original colors-is green, red and grey. Four apartments are in the building which faces north on Fountain St. Similar form stone apartments are on the west and Centennial Alley is on the east side.

A curving twelve bay above grade porch extend across the front and around the east and west elevations. It has a slightly sloping tin roof supported by columns which rest on formstone piers, and a balustrade of formstone and post railings.

Windows are arranged evenly on the facade. On the front elevation towers, dormers and throughout the house, they have 1/1 light double hung sash with plain wide stone sills and lintels.

The main entrances are in the center bays; they have recessed triangular openings. The east bay retains its stained glass transom light. The doors are decoratively carved with oval beveled glass in the center. Old screen doors, displaying decorative scroll work, remain in front of both entrance doors. Other entrances are in the rear wings.

The house has a low slate hip roof with conical slate roofs topped by finials on the two front towers. A flat roof dormer containing two windows is between the towers. Brick chimneys are in the center of the roof.

A row of small attached garages is behind the building.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The Burns Apts. is one of five similar formstone apartment units built by the Burns Brothers between 1900-1910. The Burns brothers owned a carriage factory on Green St, and when the factory burned they became land lords constructing and renting apartments or flats as they were known then. This particular building, owned by a member of the Burns family, is in excellent condition. It is a two and a half story four bay wide apartment house with a three bay circular tower at each end. All of the windows and doors retain their original parts, including the original wooden screen doors.

Taking many forms, multiple dwellings in Havre de Grace may be divided into categories. Duplexes were constructed beginning in the 19th century( see HA-835 for an early example) , and they are in the majority. Flats or apartments began to be constructed in the late 19th century; or as in the case of HA-1110, were converted from an existing structures. The last and most recent category is high rises and garden apartments. St. John's Tower , built by the Episcopal Church in the 1960's is the only high rise and there is a garden apt. across the street from it as well as several on the Chesapeake Bay.


