The Jones House is a two and a half story, four bay by one bay frame Gothic Revival cottage with a wing on the rear. The cottage's flat front is given a distinctive appearance by German siding and a center gable which is lighted by a Gothic arched window, having curved muntins in the upper sash. Many house like this one were built in Havre de Grace after the Civil War; happily most of them remain to form the town's most prevalent form of architecture.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

This Gothic Revival cottage is one of many that were built in Havre de Grace after the Civil War. It is four bays wide , one bay deep and two and a half stories tall; it has a two story wing on the rear. The house has a flat front, covered with German siding and a center gable lighted by a Gothic arched window , having curved muntins in the upper sash. A large window and two doors on the front elevation make it appear that the building may have had a shop in it at one time.

The house is located in a neighborhood, which although very shabby , preserves almost entirely its mid to late 19th century character. A livery stable (HA-1104), a house with a connecting general store (HA-1174) and a fine Federal brick townhouse, dating from the 1830's (HA1105) are some of the land marks around the junction of Franklin and N. Stokes St., a historical and potentially attractive part of Havre de Grace.

**DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE**

318 North Stokes Street is a two and a half story frame Gothic Revival Cottage with a flat front and a center gable. It is four bays wide and one bay deep with a two story wing on the rear, giving the house a t-shape. The front elevation facing east on Stokes Street is covered with German siding while the flanks and rear are clapboard.

Most of the windows in the house have 6/6 light double hung sash. The window in the north bay first floor possibly once used for displays is larger than the others and the 12 light window is stationary. A Gothic arched window, having an arched upper sash divided by curving muntins, is the front of the attic gable.

Originally the house had two entrances; but the entrance in the first bay is no longer used. Concealed by a rectangular piece of lattice, the entrance has a four paneled door with round arches in the upper panels and a three light transom. The door and enframement of the present off center entrance have been altered.

The house has a yard in the rear.

The main section has a gable flank roof with a center gable on the front elevation and a box cornice; the wing also has a gable roof. Both roofs are shingled with asphalt and have small brick central chimneys.
