DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

141 N. Washington St. is a late 19th century, three story, three bay by six bay commercial building. It is located on the corner of N. Washington St. and Pennington Ave., facing west; two story brick buildings abutt the south and east elevations. The style of the building is Italianate, and the walls are laid in common bond. Brick tie rods with lozenge shaped ends are present on the front and north elevations, all stories.

The first story, front elevation contains two rectangular display windows, filled with plate glass. Windows on the second and third story, front elevation, as well as those on the north elevation are all the same size and spaced evenly. They contain 1/1 light sash on the first and second floors and 6/6 light sash on the third floor, and have stone sills and long lintels. Covered basement windows are visible on the north elevation.

The main entrance is in the center bay, front elevation. it contains a glass door, framed with wood.

The building is covered by a flat roof, having an overhanging molded box cornice supported by pairs of scroll brackets.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The Ada Asher Building is a three story Italianate-style brick commercial building, built in the late 1880's. Its significance lies in the fact that a very similar late 19th century commercial building (HA-1114) is one building south of it.

The condition of the Ada Asher Building, a corner building, could be improved on; the bricks appear to have been repointed with Portland cement which has given them a harsh appearance. Since there have been many unsympathetic alterations made to buildings in the C.B.D., a building with a lot of alterations is rare. Thus the importance of the Ada Asher Building is not so much in its architectural merit as a single building as it is in being a part of the whole fabric of downtown Lawrence de Grace.


