DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This small frame shot-gun style house, 2 story, 2 bays by 2 bays, with a lean-to addition, has a gable roof, covered with asphalt shingles. The house is covered with asphalt shingles over shiplap. A plain chimney is just inside the south (rear) gable. The windows are double-hung, six over six. A shed hood projects over a door in the 1st story on the west elevation. The enclosed front porch has double jalousy windows on three sides. The house was probably, like 115 Alice Anne Street, two rooms deep originally; the roof covering suggests a third room has been added in the second story over what was probably a lean-to kitchen. Another lean-to covered with clapboard has probably also been added.

The house has seven rooms, including three bedrooms.

SPECIFIC DATES between 1887 and 1899 BUILDER/ARCHITECT J.T.C. Hopkins John Stevenson Williams & Rouse

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

This house is one of six houses built on Alice Anne Street and Bond Street after 1887 by J.T.C. Hopkins, John Rouse and Stevenson Williams as tenant houses. Hopkins was president of the Second National Bank of Bel Air (1888-1893); Williams was a lawyer (University of Md., Law School 1873) and President of the Harford National Bank of Bel Air after 1893; Rouse was a local merchant and a director of the Harford National Bank. Hopkins became collector of the Port of Baltimore in 1893 and in 1899 sold his share of the property to his partners for \$1,000. In 1909 Rouse, Williams, and the Fireside Permanent Building Association (which had a \$5,000 mortgage on the six lot property) sold it to Joseph T. Deckman, a tomato canner whose plant was on Vale Road near Bynum Run. (His son and grandson, both named Joseph, are in the Lacrosse Hall of Fame). At one time, Deckman owned seven of the eleven houses on that side of the street. Deckman sold it to Laura F. Jackson in 1911 (HCLR 134/55). Ms. Jackson defaulted on a mortgage in 1948, and the property was sold to Albert C. Taylor (HCLR 315/200). Mr. Taylor lost the property; as the result of a law suit it was sold at public auction to the present owner, Hannah Moore, for \$6,700 in 1964 (HCLR 645/136). Mr. Taylor is the present tenant.




