DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This long, narrow two and a half story house is at 120 Archer Street in the Town of Bel Air, Harford County, Maryland. It has an unusual roof for a small workingman's house - the gable roof runs from front to back (east to west) and is crossed at right angles in the first bay of the north and south (side) elevations. Four pane casement windows light the gables. The two windows in the second story east (front) elevation are 2/2 double-hung sash; the side windows are 6/6. The main decorative element of this house, besides the roof, is the hipped-roofed porch. It is probably not original, since its three front bays have arched openings that look more like the turn of the century. The openings are screened and the solid portions are also sided in aluminum. Their shapes call, however, for dark shingles. The porch continues around the south side for one more bay; then it is enclosed for three more bays. These bays have two pane sliding aluminum windows of a very recent period. A single story shed addition in the back (west) elevation completes the structure.

This house probably looked like its neighbor to the south, the Wyche House at 124 Archer, before its porch was altered, but its roof-line is more elegant.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

This small shot-gun style house is typical of the workingman's housing built all over Bel Air in the last quarter of the 19th century. It was built on land in the Hays Addition purchased from the Bel Air Land Company by J.T.C. Hopkins in 1884 (64/536). The Hays Addition was named for merchant Thomas Hays who owned it when he died in 1861.




