DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This two story L-shaped house is at 102 N. Bond in the Town of Bel Air, Harford County, Maryland. It has a slate roof and asphalt siding. The ell faces the street in the northern two bays of the four bay front (east) elevation. The windows are 6/6 double-hung sash. The entrance is in the bay south of the ell. A modern 20th century outside chimney rises between the two bays of the east elevation of the ell. A shed roof porch on plain square posts shades the front elevation of the main block ending in the ell.

A single story shed addition two bays wide is in the north half of the rear (west) elevation (behind the ell).

The interior of the house has been significantly altered.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

This L-shaped house was formerly the Methodist Episcopal Parsonage. It was moved to its present site between 1904 and 1930 from its site across Bond Street behind the M. E. Church. It must have served as the Parsonage for only a short time. It does not appear on the 1878 Map, and the Church build a new Parsonage on Gordon Street (next to the old school) in 1883. What style the house has would do nicely if it had been built in 1879 or 1880.
 The interior has been altered a great deal.




