DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This small two story house, the simplest kind of workingman's housing, is at 222 S. Bond Street in the Town of Bel Air, Harford County, Maryland. It has asphalt shingle siding and presents its gable end to the street. The windows are 1/1 double-hung sash in plain surrounds. The second story of the front (east) elevation has a pair of these windows. The other windows are single.

There are two shed roof porches on stock turned posts, front and rear (east and west), the front one having a plain balustrade. A plain and chimney to the west completes this simple composition.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

This very simple workingman's house is built on the site of Kennedy and Billingslea's Blacksmith Shop. Jacob Kennedy sold the property to James R. Magness in 1913 (142/169). In 1920 the house was assessed at \$184. That year Magness sold to Mary C. Wildason (Mrs. Theodore) (169/37). Mrs. Wildason died in 1942 and left the property to her daughter, Lillian May Smithson (will 21/87). Mrs. Smithson sold to the Little Gunpowder Corp. in 1966 (721/274), and the corporation sold it in 1970 to the present owner, Frederick Hodous (842/562).


