This is another of Jacob Bu-1's Queen Anne houses, built for D. Preston Wysong. The aluminum siding has effaced the shingles that gave it character, but the Queen Anne elements Bel Air liked so well, the broad gables and deep porches, appear here. The original double front doors and the scroll porch balustrade are noteworthy.

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This large, irregular two and a half story aluminum sided house with various gables is at 83 E. Broadway in the Town of Bel Air, Harford County, Maryland. The original portion was 31' x 38'. The irregular massing, the various gables, and the porch, hipped-roofed with stock turned posts and a carved ballustrade suggest the Queen Anne as does the setback of the east bay of the second story front (north) elevation and the carved brackets supporting the portion of the front gable which overhangs, and the triple window in the same gable. The windows are 1/1 double hung sash and probably 20th century replacements. The double doors on the north side are original, however, with their long round-arched windows over round arched panels. A large single pane transom completes the entrance. It was probably the main entrance. A smaller single door is in the north bay of the east elevation and another is in the ell under a shed roofed porch with plain square posts and a horizontal board balustrade.

The ell to the south has a gable roofed dormer in the middle of the east slope of the gable roof.

The west elevation has a two story hexagonal bay window in the south bay of the main block. To the north of that is a one story shed-roofed enclosure.

A metal balcony (fire escape?) is under the triple windows of the front gable.

If other houses like this built by Jacob Bull are any example, the original siding was probably shiplap and there were decorative shingles in the gables and possibly on the second story front setback.

The building is divided into five apartments.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

This large and fairly irregular house was built by D. Preston Wysong in 1887 on land purchased from the heirs of Dr. Munnikhuysen for \$500 (58/519). Jacob Bull, Bel Air's Master builder, built the original 31' x 38' block. It is not clear whether the Wysongs ever lived there although they owned the house until 1893. Miss Roberta Archer moved her school there in the Fall of 1888. The Wysongs sold the property to Elizabeth Winchester in 1893 for \$3000. Probably the back building had been added by then because that is a fairly high price for Broadway property in the depression year of 1893.

Miss Winchester left the property to Arthur C. Howard, who was living in Baltimore City when he sold it to Corinne C. Dunnigan in 1936 (239/441). Later that year Dunnigan, also of Baltimore City, sold it to W. Paul Haughay and his wife Alfreida (241/217). Mrs. Haughay is the owner of record today.

Although the house has been covered in aluminum siding obscuring the original shingles and siding, and the house is divided into five apartments, enough is left for one to see the irregularity of massing so dear to the hearts of the Victorians. Enough is left to call it Queen Anne, considering the massing, the carved balustrade, and the almost invisible carved brackets under the large front (north) gable.






