DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

Beaver Neck is one of the few early eighteenth century dwellings surviving in the Tuckahoe Creek area of Talbot County. It is a three bay one and one half story brick structure with small ~~one~~ and one half story frame kitchen wing on the southeast. Its walls are laid in Flemish bond with glazed headers above a stepped water table. However, the walls have been painted white which conceals the decorative brickwork. Like most houses of this form, Beaver Neck has a central entrance flanked by two windows with 6/6 sash and louvered blinds. On both sides of the "A" roof are three dormers, also having 6/6 sash. Within both gables rise the chimneys, the one adjacent the kitchen being the larger of the two. On the northwest gable is a single window on the first story and two on the second. The latter two differ in size, one being a 4-pane casement and the other having 4/4 pane sash.

The kitchen wing has a series of three 4-pane casements on its southwest facade. On the roof is a single dormer, the same size as the others. There is no chimney in the kitchen wing.

From the general form, the house appears to have a hall and parlour plan with kitchen addition.

Beaver Neck is an important survivor of an early house form which has maintained its early form with little alteration or addition thereto. In form it is similar to the original part of Lowe's Point and the original part of Lloyd's Landing.



From the exterior, it is not possible to determine the age of Beaver Neck. This type of house was built from the 17th century to the end of the 18th century on the Eastern Shore.

Essentially it is a 1 1/2 story brick structure, 3 bays long and one room deep with a one bay 1 1/2 story frame wing. The entire structure is painted white so it is difficult to see the Flemish bond with glazed headers on the northwest and southwest facades. Within each gable is a chimney still retaining what appears to be an original cap. Where the bargeboards abut the chimney a one brick band (or belt) protrudes, protecting the end of the barge. The door is located in the center bay of both facades. Three dormers pierce the "A" roof only on the southwest side. Windows throughout have 6/6 sash. Arches on the northeast side are comprised of a row of vertical headers.

The house is located in the midst of a large farm. It is well maintained by the owners.
