Description of Property and Eligibility Determination: *(Use continuation sheet if necessary and attach map and photo)*

This house is an altered example of a vernacular farmhouse, which is arranged as a center hall plan dwelling. Center-hall dwellings are rectangular houses characterized by a symmetrical organization of rooms on either side of a hallway passing through the center of the house from front to rear. The center passage provides access to the surrounding rooms and usually contains the only exterior doors as well as the stairway to the second floor. One to two-and-one-half stories in height, and one or two rooms deep, the central passage house generally has a side-gable, gambrel, or hipped roof. While the house on this property exhibits many traits common to a center-hall dwelling, it also features multiple modern additions, including modern panel doors with modern storm doors. The house is clad in modern aluminum siding and features a modern one-story front porch. These modern alterations significantly detract from the historic character of the house. The house is therefore not eligible for listing in the National Register under Criterion C.

Originally constructed as part of a farm, the property exhibits no distinctive traits which set it apart from other area farms. There is also no significant history associated with the farm. The property therefore is not eligible for listing in the National Register under Criterion A. The property is not known to have been associated with any significant individuals, and is therefore not eligible under Criterion B. As per the Maryland Historic Trust letter dating May 15, 2001 (appended at end of document) no archaeological concerns were identified at this time. Therefore the property is therefore not eligible under Criterion D.




