Dear Mr. Menke:

On May 1, 1986, the Montgomery County Planning Board held a public hearing, as required under the Moratorium on Alteration and Demolition, Section 24A-10 of the County's Historic Preservation Ordinance, to make a finding on the significance of the Cecil Farm, identified as Site #10/65 in the Locational Atlas and Index of Historic Sites in Montgomery County, Maryland.

This site, located at 25115 Old One Hundred Road, was found not to warrant designation on the master plan. At the conclusion of the hearing the Planning Board closed the record on the site and voted unanimously to remove this property from the Locational Atlas in order to allow the issuance of a demolition permit on the site.

Although removed from the Locational Atlas the site will remain on the Maryland Historical Trust's Inventory.
