

Dear Dr. Graham:

During its regular meeting on September 14, 1994, the Montgomery County Planning Board conducted a public hearing, as required under the Moratorium on Alteration and Demolition - Section 24A-10 of the County's Historic Preservation Ordinance, in order to make a finding on the significance of the **Duvall-Kemp Farm, 9510 Hawkins Creamery Road, Damascus**, which is identified in the Locational Atlas and Index of Historic Sites as Resource #11/26. This action was taken pursuant to an application by the owner for a demolition permit on this property.

After taking testimony on this issue, the three Board members in attendance found that this resource does not warrant designation on the Master Plan for Historic Preservation. At the conclusion of the hearing, the Board closed the record and voted three to zero to not designate this property as a historic site and to allow the issuance of a demolition permit.
