DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This two and a half story, four bay by one bay, brick house originally faced south.

Built on stone foundations, Fletchall House is constructed of common bonded brick on all elevations, except the south elevation. The south elevation has Flemish bonded brick work which suggests that the south elevation was originally the "front" elevation. The south (front) porch has been removed and a one story frame addition, constructed on poured concrete foundations, has been added. This addition has been covered by white aluminum siding and has a flat roof. A black wrought iron railing marks the edge of the roof and encloses the area as a porch at the second level. The original south (front) door remains hidden behind the south addition. This door is composed of glass and wood panels and surmounted by an four light transom. The north (new front) porch is a poured concrete slab enclosed on two sides by a black wrought iron railing. The north door is identical to the south, and is composed of six glass and wood panels.

Windows are set into flat arches and are flanked by green wooden louvered shutters. The west three bays of the original house at the first floor have nine over nine double hung windows and the remainder of the windows are six over six double hung.

The house has a gable roof with slate covering. The east addition has a slightly lower roof than the west section of the house. Both east and west sections have a sawtooth cornice line. There is one interior brick chimney between the east and west sections and one interior end chimney at the west elevation.

The house originally was rectangular and had a central hall flanked on the east and west. The east addition was built in 1945 by a Mr. Buchanan and created a kitchen area. More recently the frame addition to the south provided space for a ground level bedroom. North of the kitchen is an enclosed utility room.

The open string two run stairway ascends, south to north, along the east interior wall. It has a carved hand rail and square balusters. The house has no subfloors and random width floorboards. Walls and ceilings are plaster, in some instances the plaster has been applied directly to the brick and other lines; some walls have been papered. Doors are wooden paneled and have simple and bullseye moldings.

The house is set on a hillside, at a considerable distance from the road.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

"Flint's Grove", containing 300 acres on Dry Seneca Creek, was surveyed for John Flint on July 4, 1722.¹ By 1793 the land had passed out of the Flint family, and was divided among several owners; the present 151 3/8 acres was shared by Ann Fletchall (with 50 acres and 3 slaves) and Ninian Clagett (with 100 acres and 8 slaves).²

Throughout the 19th century, Flint's Grove passed back and forth between the Fletchall and Chiswell families as they intermarried, bequeathed, and sold the property among themselves. Thomas Fletchall in 1819 bequeathed to his daughter Sarah 152 3/8 acres, valued at \$2.63 per acre, but without reference to improvements.³ By the 1825 sale of Flint's Grove from Sarah and her husband William Chiswell to Sarah N. Fletchall,⁴ there was a structure on Flint's Grove. Mrs. Fletchall, with her 9 slaves, lived on the farm with her niece and adopted daughter, Rachel A. Chiswell and husband William A. Chiswell, and their four children until her death at age 78 in 1862. With the execution of Sarah Fletchall's will, Rachel became the owner of Flint's Grove.⁵

In January 1867, William and Rachel Chiswell sold Flint's Grove with its 152 3/8 acres to Thomas Fyffe for \$6,200.⁶ Fyffe farmed the land for 16 years, during which time Cattail Road was laid out to connect the public road **from Rockville to Monocacy (present Route 28) with that from Rockville to Poolesville (White's Ferry Road)**; Fyffe was paid \$504 for damages in building the 2-mile long road.⁷ Fyffe sold Flint's Grove to George W. and Arthur P. Fletchall in 1883 for \$6,500.⁸ Excepting 1 acre granted to Mary Hoskinson for a cemetery, the farm was subsequently sold to James B. Wise in 1909.⁹

After Wise's death, his wife Lula sold the property to John D. Buchanan,¹⁰ who installed plumbing and electricity. After a three-year ownership by John and Christine Edmands,¹¹ the present owners, Thomas and Laura Conlon, bought Flint's Grove.¹² Mrs. Conlon still occupies the house.

Flint's Grove is important as an example of a fine house owned for most of its lifetime by locally prominent and prosperous farmers. The Chiswells and Fletchalls were among the earliest settlers of the north-western part of Montgomery County. Both families received early patents and moved here from Anne Arundel County and both had large land holdings throughout the area. Members of these families were active citizens, holding a number of public offices.

This two and a half story, four bay by one bay common bonded brick house originally faced south. It now faces north. A one story frame addition has replaced the original south front porch (south elevation flemish bonded). This was a two room house with a central hall. This was expanded by an east addition in 1945 constructed also of brick. There are nine over nine and six over six double hung windows. There is a sawtooth cornice line and a gable roof with slate covering.
10. Significance
Flint's Grove is important as an example of a fine house owned by locally prominent and prosperous farmers -- the Fletchalls and Chiswells. Both families received early patents and moved here from Anne Arundel County and both had large land holdings throughout the area. Members of these families were active citizens, holding a number of public offices. "Flint's Grove" was a 300 acre grant owned by John Flint in 1722. The present 151 5/8 acres was shared by Ann Fletchall (with 50 acres and 3 slaves) and Ninian Clagett (with 100 acres and 8 slaves) in 1793. Throughout the 19th century, "Flint's Grove" passed back and forth between the Fletchall and Chiswell families as they intermarried, bequeathed, and sold the property among themselves. By 1825 the house was constructed to accommodate large families. In 1883 Cattail Road was laid out through the property to connect the public road from Rockville to Monocacy (present Route 28) with that from Rockville to Poolesville (White's Ferry Road). The owner was paid \$504 for damages in building the two-mile road.

Fireplaces at either end have late Federal mantles.</p> <p>East of the house is a log meat house with board-and-batten siding.</p>
