STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

According to deed 194/442, this one acre tract was purchased by Nathan and Elxina Duffin in 1907 from James E. and Sarah T. Williams. Since the house was too expensive to have been a tenant house and the Williams resided elsewhere, this house was probably built at the time of purchase by the Duffins.

It is similar to nearby homes of Joshua Duffin, Addison Duffin, and other Black landowners.

According to Edna Duffin Johnson and her sister Lorraine Duffin, her family referred to Nathan Duffin as "Cousin Nace." This is another example of extended families in rural Black communities. His descendants continue to live in the area.




