The Snyder Hotel was built in several sections. The original section is the south end, built in the mid-1800s by Hannah and William Poole. The three-bay, side gable structure has a central door with a small transom. The structure has a braced frame structure with large log floor joists.¹

Harriet Snyder built the three-story section north block in 1905 to accommodate a hotel business. The hotel block, three stories tall and two bays wide, is clearly influence by Italianate commercial architecture popular in the late 1800s. It has a nearly flat shed roof with a wide bracketed cornice. The hotel block has a hallway with two parlors.

The structure is covered with asbestos shingle siding. The windows are 2/2 sash. The roof is standing seam metal.

The front porch is enclosed and has a stone foundation. A rear one-story porch is partially enclosed. The concrete block porch base has a poured concrete floor deck.

The Snyder Hotel represents the summer resort industry of the greater Germantown area after the Metropolitan Branch of the B&O Railroad was completed in 1873. Washingtonians wishing to escape the heat and threat of malaria came to Montgomery County.

William and Hannah Poole built the three-bay house in the mid-1800s. They are shown living here in 1879, on the Hopkins Atlas. They sold the property to their daughter, Harriet Ann Poole Snyder (b1853), in 1886. Hannah continued to live with her daughter after the transaction.²

Harriet married Rhinaldo Snyder (1842-1910) about 1875. In 1900, they had six children, born between 1880 and 1897. Rhinaldo earned a living as a trucker. The Snyders built the three-story section of the hotel in 1905 to accommodate their hotel business. Harriet met vacationers at the Germantown Train station and brought them to the hotel.³

The hotel was known as the Snyder House and Hotel, and earlier as the Montgomery Inn. The hotel offered bed and board and was a popular place for family dining⁴.

Rhinaldo died in 1910 in Cedar Grove.⁵ Harriet continued to own the property. In 1923, she bought additional property, being the former Cedar Heights School, on the west side of Ridge Road. Harriet sold the hotel in 1931.⁶ Since 1945, the structure has been owned by the Applebys who have operated an antiques business in it.



Constructed c1886 and modified in 1905, this structure is significant as a turn-of-the-century hotel. Known as "Montgomery Inn" or "Sydney Hotel," it was a modest example of the hotels and rooming houses which catered to vacationers seeking ^{relief} from the heat of the city. During the late 19th + early 20th c a number of areas in Montgomery County, most of which were located on or near the path of the Metropolitan Branch of the B & O Railroad, became popular retreats for Washingtonians.

The Snyder House and Hotel is a large vernacular structure built during the mid to late nineteenth century and then substantially added to in 1905. The building is most significant as the turn of the century "Montgomery Inn" or Snyder's Hotel, as it was later referred to. During the later nineteenth and early twentieth centuries a number of areas in Montgomery County, most of which were located on or near the path of the Metropolitan Branch of the B&O Railroad, became popular retreats, especially for Washingtonians wishing to escape the heat of the city during the summer months. The Montgomery Inn was one such retreat. Mrs. Snyder herself would pick-up vacationers at the Germantown B&O station and bring them out to the hotel.¹ Montgomery Inn offered bed and board as well as being a popular spot for family dining.² The building, rather plain in architectural design, has under gone a few changes over the years but has basically retained its turn of the century appearance.

The original section of the building, the two story part to the south, was probably built in the late 1880's by Harriet W. Snyder (but may be earlier).³ Harriet purchased 7 acres of the "Cow Pasture" tract in May of 1886 from Hannah and William Poole for \$110.⁴ Then in 1905, Harriet had the larger, three story section built.⁵ Harriet owned the property until 1931 after which time the house passed through a succession of owners. In January of 1945 it was purchased by Harry and Marguerite Appleby.⁶ Harry, an auto mechanic with his own business, died in March of 1978 leaving the property to Marguerite.⁷ Margeruite has operated an antique shop out of the house for the past 10 years.⁸




