DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

In the late 1800's a Methodist Church stood on the northeast side of Clopper Road, near the intersection of Clopper and Germantown Roads and directly across from the intersection of Clopper and Schaeffer Roads. Nothing is known about the appearance of the building except that it was of log construction. Part of the foundation may still exist, but the site was overgrown (as of October, 1984) and it was impossible to determine whether anything remains.

The Church cemetery is also badly overgrown, but at least one complete gravestone, with the name Leaman inscribed on it, remains. It is thought that there are two or three other gravestones at the site, but it has been difficult to locate them, given the condition of the cemetery site. Members of the German families who settled the area in the mid-19th century were buried in the Methodist Church cemetery.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The old Methodist Church and cemetery consists of approximately $\frac{1}{4}$ of an acre, deeded to the Trustees of the Methodist Episcopal Church in 1866 by Solomon Leaman and others so that "said trustees shall erect or build---a house or place of worship for the use of the members of the M.E. Church". The Clopper Road Church was in use until the early part of the century, when the "northern" contingent which had used it after a split in the congregation between "northern" and "southern" factions built a new church in New Germantown. A deed dated February, 1903 conveys the same parcel of land mentioned in the 1866 deed to the "Trustees of the Trinity Methodist Episcopal Church", incorporated in 1903. The "southern" contingent of the Clopper Road Church built, in 1902, a new church building on Germantown Road, near the intersection of Germantown and Clopper Roads. They used that building (now a medical clinic) until the 1930's, when both factions of the old Clopper Road Church reunited at the Trinity United Methodist Church in New Germantown.

It is interesting to note that Trinity United Methodist intends to erect a new church building in the near future on a site across from the 19th century church, on Clopper Road.

The site of the church and the cemetery are significant because of their relationship to the development of the Methodist Church in Montgomery County and because of its association with the German families who settled in the area in the 19th century and helped to shape its history.


