Prepare both a summary paragraph and a general description of the resource and its various elements as it exists today.

This barn is a small, concrete block barn with a steeply pitched gambrel roof, covered with rusting sheet metal. The distinctive feature of this barn is the sheathing of the gambrel ends with diagonal boards forming a chevron pattern. Each end has an opening into the hayloft which, judging from the remains of hinges, was closed with a pair of doors or shutters. The concrete block is rough, probably dating from the 1940's. The east elevation has six windows and a door. The sash in the windows are loose six-light wooden sash taken from another building. Plain wood boards trim the exterior of these windows. The window openings have no lintels, per se. The concrete block walls end at the top of the windows, and the plate for the roof rests on the top of this wall, acting as a lintel for the openings below. The west elevation contains three windows and a dutch door. The interior and the south elevation of the barn were inaccessible.


