Located at 13601 Travilah Road, Potomac, Mount Prospect is an early twentieth century domestic and agricultural complex. Designed by T.C. Groomes, a Rockville architect, in 1901-2, the existing frame farmhouse rises two and one half stories, depicts an oblong shape and is capped by a hipped roof. Characterized by a central gable with Palladian window, Tuscan columns and central hall plan, the house displays a unique feature in its attic windows. Outbuildings include a noteworthy barn with hipped roof and wooden cupolas, corn crib, hay barn and silo. Montgomery County HPC determined that the house was significant as local representative of the Georgian Revival style. Together with the intact early twentieth century barn and other outbuildings, Mount Prospect exhibits distinct characteristics of type and period for a rural residential/agricultural complex, a surviving example in the developing county. The Trust concurred that the property was eligible for the National Register. The residential development of the property will retain the historic property with all the contributing resources on 14 acres.

<p>The house is a two and a half story, frame structure with a five bay, main () facade. The central doorway has transom and sidelights. On the second floor, the central window has a pediment motif. The other windows are 2/2 double hung sash. The attic has low, horizontal windows under the eaves with vertical boarding between. There is a central facade gable with a palladian revival window. The house has a low hipped roof. Across the facade there is a one story porch with turned posts and brick bases. In plan, the house has two ranges of three rooms; the front, center room is the stairhall.</p> <p>Behind the house there is a stone foundation for an outbuilding that no longer stands.</p> <p>The barn is a large structure, also with a hipped roof. There are large, square, louvered lanterns or ventilators on the roof. There is a corn crib beside the barn. The silo is an early twentieth century poured concrete structure.</p>



ACTION TAKEN


