9. Description: The main structure is a two-story, clapboard farmhouse typical of those seen in the County. The main facade of three bays faces north and there is a doorway in the center bay. Windows are all two-over-two, double hung. A large stone chimney is fixed to the exterior west wall, and may have been added after the house was built. There is a stove-pipe, brick stack at the east end of the roof. There are several later additions to the rear. A tenant house, built partially of logs, sits near the main house.

10. Significance: A simple late 19th century farmhouse, now much expanded, the original structure is still readily discernible. Surrounded by c. 16 acres the property still conveys a sense of a late 19th c. farm in the Potomac area. The land on which this house sits was originally part of the "Cabin John Farm" of Henry Bradley. In 1886, Bradley sold 17 acres to Thomas J. Conley, who conveyed it to Greenbury Jackson in 1888. It is probably that Jackson built the house around 1890. He sold the property in 1906 and it had a number of owners in the next 40 years until 1946, when it was purchased by the present owner.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The land where this house sits was originally part of the "Cabin John Farm" of Henry Bradley. On December 10, 1886, Bradley and his wife, Elspeth Bradley sold a 17 acre portion to Thomas J. Conley for \$212.55. This parcel was located "on Bradley's lane (now Kentsdale Drive)...northwest of the residence of William Clagett."¹ Two years later, on May 24, 1888, Conley conveyed the 17 acre lot to Greenbury Jackson, for \$500.² It is uncertain whether this price increase indicates merely a profitable speculative deal on the part of Conley, or the erection of the house sometime between the two dates of conveyance. The former situation appears to be the more plausible. The house is depicted on the Hopkins Map of 1894, indicated under the name "G. Jackson". In all likelihood, the main house was constructed by Jackson around the year 1890.

Jackson and his wife sold the property in 1906 to John T. Mock,³ the first of a succession of transfers during the next 40 years.⁴ On May 20, 1946, the property was purchased by Julian Stein, the current owner.⁵ The house has been elaborately expanded by modern additions, yet the original structure has not lost its primary characteristics and is still readily identifiable.

SUBJECT: Amendment to the Approved and Adopted Master Plan for Historic Preservation in Montgomery County, Maryland

WHEREAS, in September, 1983, the Montgomery County Planning Board transmitted to the Montgomery County Council the Final Draft Amendment to the Historic Preservation Master Plan, proposing the addition of several historic sites for inclusion in the Master Plan and the removal of several sites from the Locational Atlas and Index of Historic Sites in Montgomery County, Maryland; and

WHEREAS, on December 13, 1983, the Montgomery County Council held a public hearing wherein oral and written testimony was received concerning the Final Draft Amendment to the Historic Preservation Master Plan; and

WHEREAS, on May 22, 1984, the Council Planning, Housing and Economic Development Committee reviewed the Final Draft Amendment to the Historic Preservation Master Plan and the issues raised at the public hearing with the Montgomery County Planning Board, staff and affected parties; and

WHEREAS, the Montgomery County Council reviewed the recommendations of the Planning, Housing and Economic Development Committee at a worksession held on June 11, 1984.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the County Council, sitting as a District Council for that portion of the Maryland-Washington Regional District within Montgomery County, that -

The Historic Preservation Master Plan is hereby amended by the inclusion of the following sites and/or resources:




SITES NOT RECOMMENDED FOR REGULATION UNDER THE


