Description:

The Andrew Chapel Site and Cemetery, constructed circa 1870, was previously surveyed by Sugarloaf Regional Trails in September 1978. A marker within the cemetery marks the location of the Andrew Chapel, which was demolished in 1965. The property has not been altered since the previous survey.

National Register Evaluation:


The Andrew Chapel Site and Cemetery, which dates to the 1870s, is not eligible for the National Register of Historic Places. The property is not eligible under Criterion A, as research conducted indicates no association with any historic events or trends significant in the development of national, state or local history. Historic research indicates that the property has no association with persons who have made specific contributions to history, and therefore, it does not meet Criterion B. It is not eligible under Criterion C. The site has no distinctive plan or landscaping features which indicate an organized design, and the headstones are traditional types commonly used. The cemetery does not meet Criteria Consideration D, as historic research indicates that the site does not contain graves of persons of transcendent importance, nor does it contain grave markers of distinctive design. In addition, the site has no association with historic events or broad patterns of history and has no potential to yield important information. Finally, the site is not eligible under Criterion D as it has no known potential to yield important information.

10. Significance: The Colesville Cemetery is an important genealogical source because it contains many graves of old area families. Among the stones are those marking graves of the Fawcetts, a local milling family. Benjamin Fawcett, who died in 1898, was one of the original trustees of Andrew Chapel, built on this land, and a member of the Maryland House of Delegates in 1864 and 1865.
- Andrew Chapel of the Methodist Episcopal Church, South, was organized in 1866 and the church was completed in 1869. The original clapboard church was replaced by a larger brick church in 1938, called the Andrew Chapel Methodist Church, after the different branches of the Methodist Church united in 1939. The growth of the congregation required a larger building, so the Colesville Methodist Church across Randolph Road was built in 1959. Andrew Chapel was razed in 1965.

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Colesville Cemetery is located east of New Hampshire Avenue on Randolph Road, and is bordered by second-growth woods and Randolph Road. The terrain is flat, except that one corner slopes down into the woods. A small pile of old bouquets and plastic flowers lies there. A wire fence surrounds three sides, and a wooden fence faces the road. A short semi-circle paved driveway runs into the property.

All the graves, with the exception of one, face east. Many have small stones with initials placed at the feet. Most twentieth century grave stones have polished surfaces and rough edges. The nineteenth century stones are white with worn carved letters of names, dates, and short prayers. Some of these have five to ten foot monuments. The most elaborate stone of all is on a Hobbs grave in the first row. It is approximately three feet long and three feet high, with the scene of the Last Supper carved on it.

The newest grave dates August, 1978. The oldest grave is that of Thomas Fawcett, who died in January, 1871.

The older graves are generally located in the western end of the cemetery. To the east lie the early twentieth century ones, and to the south are the most recent graves. In the middle, surrounded by large boxwoods, stands a metal sign that says "Colesville Cemetery." It give a few notices of when plastic flowers are permitted, and two telephone numbers for information: 384-1941, 384-6059. Outside of this grove lies a small black plaque with gold letters:

Former Sight of Andrew's
 Methodist Church November 7, 1869
 Rebuilt December 11, 1938
 Razed January 20, 1965

There are several trees in each corner of the cemetery, and many bushes are scattered in the interior. Two family plots have a stone bench for decoration. There is only one grave that has a small metal identification sign as a monument. There is not much room left inside the fences for future graves.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The Colesville Cemetery is an important genealogical source as it contains many monuments marking the graves of old area families. Among the stones are those marking graves of the Fawcetts, a local milling family.¹ One of the members of the family, Benjamin who died on January 8, 1898, was one of the original trustees of the church built on this land and a member of the Maryland House of Delegates in 1864 and 1865.² Members of the Valdinar family, who owned the land prior to 1872 when it became church property, are also buried here. Of interest are two monuments to people who died before the land was used as a cemetery: Hannah wife of Lloyd Green, born October 21, 1819, died February 7, 1858; and Wil^m Culver Valdinar, born May 30, 1823, died August 9, 1852.

The Cemetery also contains a bronze plaque indicating the site of the former Andrew Chapel of the Methodist Episcopal Church, South, an outgrowth or continuation of Federal Chapel (off present New Hampshire Avenue; c.1784-c.1870) and continuing today as the Colesville Methodist Church.

Andrew Chapel was organized in 1866 and a building committee of Federal Methodist Episcopal Church, South, reported the completion and dedication of their new church Andrew Chapel (near Colesville) on November 7, 1869.³ The land legally became church property on September 21, 1872, when Francis Valdenar and Elizabeth, his wife, deeded approximately 1 1/8 acres, part of a tract of land known as "Two Farms", to Benjamin Fawcett, John Winpenney, William E. Shaw, Joseph Fawcett, and Samuel B. Rhine, Trustees, for use as a place of Divine Worship of the Methodist Episcopal Church, South.⁴ Approximately 1 acre of additional land was acquired for cemetery use on June 26, 1922.⁵

The original clapboard church built in 1869 was replaced by a larger brick church in 1938 called the Andrew Chapel Methodist Church after the different branches of the Methodist Church united in 1939. It was razed on January 20, 1965, after the growth of the congregation had required the erection of a larger building across Randolph Road (Colesville Methodist Church) in 1959.⁶


