Prepare both a summary paragraph and a general description of the resource and its various elements as it exists today.

The estate area of the "Springbrook" subdivision is a community of fine, custom built homes located in a picturesque area of winding roads, sloping hills and large wooded lots. It is situated between New Hampshire Avenue to the east and Northwest Branch park land to the west and is approximately one mile from Rt. 29.

This community of simple country estates was laid out and plated on January 29, 1940 by the Woodmoor Development Corporation. The present community includes a circa. 1903 home, a number of homes dating from the 1940's and a few more modern homes including some recently built. The 1940's residences built following the platting of the subdivision are characterized by one-and-a-half stories, a small square main block with descending wings and a steep gable roof with or without dormers. They are of any combination of brick, stone and frame construction built in a fairly traditional, simple yet nicely appointed architectural style.

HISTORY & SUPPORT

The estate area of the "Springbrook" subdivision is a collection of fine custom homes on large lots. The community has the feel of the country with its winding lanes, sloping hills and large green lawns with an abundance of trees. "Springbrook" was platted on January 29, 1940 by the Woodmoor Development Corporation. It was layed out on property which had formerly been the Bean family farm of 255 1/2 acres. The president of the Woodmoor Development Corporation, Mr. George Moss, had in mind a community of three to eight acre "estates" in an area which at that time was largely open country yet not too far from downtown Silver Spring and Washington, D.C. Mr. Moss himself lived in this community for many years. The idea was slow to catch on, but eventually the lots were sold.

The present "Springbrook" community includes the circa. 1903 Bean family residence, a number of residences dating from the 1940's and a few more modern homes including some recently built. The 1940's house type which accounts for a good part of the estate area is characterized by a one-and-a-half story home built of any combination of brick, stone and frame construction. The architectural style is fairly traditional. Most of these homes consist of a small, square main block with decending wings to one or both sides; a variation on the American dream house of the 1930's and 1940's-- the Cape Cod Cottage. The roofs are steeply gabled, some with dormers.

Of particular note is the Bean family residence. This property was purchased by John T. Bean on November 8, 1888 from William E. Shaw (of neighboring "Quaint Acres"). It then consisted of 255 1/2 acres of "Easy Purchase" (Deed EBP 23/169). The present house was built in 1903 according to the current owner and county records. The property was sold in December of 1939 to the Woodmoor Development Corporation, who then subdivided it. The house itself was sold on a 4.79 acre lot in May of 1941. It then passed through a succession of owners. From July of 1949 until June of 1952 it was the home of Texas Congressman Lloyd M. Bentsen and his wife, Beryl. They then sold the property to the present owners, Blair Lee III and his wife, Mathilde Boal Lee. Mr. Lee, involved in both politics and real estate, is a former Maryland governor; the only one so far to be a native of Montgomery County. Their home is an attractive, traditional style two story frame house with a mansard roof with dormers. Mr. Lee reports that the only change made to the exterior was his addition of aluminum siding.

Also of interest is the Odend'hal house at #420 Warrenton Drive. This house was built in 1942 on lot #1 block E of Springbrook. Lloyd and Evelyn Odend'hal purchased the property from the Woodmoor Development Corporation on September 30, 1940 (Deed 798/75). It is a two story brick residence which an almost Medieval look with its heavy masonry massing and rounded tower with a pointed top located at the northeast

corner elevation. The Odend'hals sold the house on October 17, 1946 to John K. and Edith A. Witherspoon. They in turn sold it on October 17, 1951 to Elizabeth R. McConnell. The house presently belongs to the heirs of Mrs. McConnell.

Houses #307 and #110, both typical of the house type found in the "Springbrook" estate area as discussed, were built in the mid 1940's. #307 was built for Andrew and Ella Kessinger and #110 for Ralph and Helen Queen. House #200, also typical, was the home of George J. Moss, president of the Woodmoor Development Corporation and his wife, Joyce from 1940 until 1963. It was then purchased by the present owners, Dr. Dwight R. and Hilde T. Smith. Houses #200 and #10 are larger, two story frame houses.
