Description:

The Dr. Fox House was previously surveyed in 1985. At that time no determination of eligibility was made and no boundaries were given.



Access to the Dr. Fox House was denied by the owner. However, the house appears to be unchanged from the previous description.

National Register Evaluation:

The Dr. Fox House, constructed circa 1885, is eligible for the National Register of Historic Places under Criterion C, as an excellent example of a Victorian-era house. The property represents the early settlement of this area of Beltsville by a prominent citizen of the town. It has excellent integrity, and retains many distinctive features, including a clipped-gable roof supported by console brackets, floor-to-ceiling windows on the first story, and a canted bay on the east elevation. The property is not eligible under Criterion A, as research conducted indicates no association with any historic events or trends significant in the development of national, state, or local history. Historic research indicates that the property has no association with persons who have made specific contributions to history, and therefore, it does not meet Criterion B. Finally, the structure has no known potential to yield important information, and therefore, is not eligible under Criterion D.


Verbal Boundary Description and Justification:

The National Register boundaries of the Dr. Fox House Property follow the current property lines of 4931 Powder Mill Road (Tax Map 19 and Parcel 52 of Block 17). This .4 hectare (1.0 acre) parcel is bounded on the south, east, and west by adjacent parcels and on the north by Powder Mill Road. The boundary includes the house. According to deed research, the property was originally part of a 1.03 hectare (2.56-acre) parcel which was purchased by Dr. Charles Fox in 1886. The property was reduced to the present size in 1923 when the heirs of Charles Fox sold the property to Mattie Coffin.



Description:

The Dr. Charles Fox House is a gable-roofed frame Victorian dwelling located on a one-acre lot in Beltsville just northwest of St. John's Episcopal Church and graveyard. The house is set back from Powder Mill Road on a deep and narrow lot, and faces slightly east of north. The house consists of a two-and-one-half-story three-bay-by-two-bay main block, with two wings. The main north facade is three bays wide with entrance in the first bay through a modern door with a modern (Classical Revival) surround. Windows on the first story are 2/4 floor-to-ceiling double-hung-sash with plain board lintels; second story windows are 2/2 double-hung-sash and have plain board lintels with top molding. Above the central bay at third level is a steep cross-gable with jerkinhead roof. Within this central gable is a small rectangular shuttered window; two console brackets support the cornice. The jerkinhead treatment is repeated at the east and west gable ends. Extending east from the main block is a one-story gable-roofed wing, which features on its east gable end a semi-hexagonal bay with bracketed cornice. The house rests on a high brick foundation; siding is German, painted olive green on the main facade, and blue in the rear. The roof is red tin. Attached to the south facade is a two-story gable-roof kitchen wing.

Significance:

The Dr. Charles Fox House is a good example of a Victorian town dwelling house. Although it has been expanded and altered, it exhibits several features which are rare in Prince George's County: its strongly vertical lines and its clipped gables supported by console brackets. The house was probably built circa 1886, when Dr. Charles A. Fox purchased a town lot from John Simms, Beltsville's most prosperous merchant. Dr. Fox, a physician from Virginia who since 1869 had lived and practiced in Vansville, purchased a 2-9/16 acre lot which adjoined the Episcopal cemetery on the west. The house was probably built within that year; the doctor's office (east wing) may have been added around the turn of the century. Dr. Fox was for many years not only the village doctor for Beltsville, but was also active in a variety of civic affairs. He died in 1915, and his family continued to occupy the house until 1923; it is still locally known as the "Dr. Fox House". In the last half century, during the residence of the Coffin and Beebe families, the Dr. Fox House has seen alterations and expansion. It is, however, a noticeable and unique landmark in the historic town of Beltsville.

The Dr. Charles Fox House is a gable-roofed frame Victorian dwelling located on a one-acre lot in Beltsville just northwest of St. John's Episcopal Church and graveyard. The house is set back from Powder Mill Road on a deep and narrow lot, and faces slightly east of north. The house consists of a two-and-one-half-story three-bay-by-two-bay main block, with two wings. The main north facade is three bays wide with entrance in the first bay through a modern door with a modern (Classical Revival) surround, i.e., fluted pilasters and dentilled broken pediment. Across this main facade is a high concrete porch approached by a flight of steps. Windows on the first story are 2/4 floor-to-ceiling double-hung-sash with plain board lintels; second story windows are 2/2 double-hung-sash and have plain board lintels with top molding. All have black louvered shutters. Above the central bay at third level is a steep cross-gable with jerkinhead (or clipped gable) roof. Within this central gable is a small rectangular shuttered window with plain board surround and two console brackets supporting the cornice. The jerkinhead treatment is repeated at the east and west gable ends; in these locations there are two small windows at third level. Again the cornice in each location is supported by two console brackets. The cornice throughout the main block is boxed and has crown molding.

Extending east from the main block is a one-story shallow gable-roofed wing, which features on its east gable end a semi-hexagonal bay. This projecting hip-roofed bay has three 1/1 double-hung-sash windows and a bracketed cornice.

The house rests on a high brick foundation; there is no basement under the main block. The siding is German, painted olive green on the main facade, and blue in the rear; the trim is painted white. The roof is tin painted red. There is an interior chimney in the south plane of the roof near the eaves, and a tall exterior corbelled brick chimney pierces the eaves at the east gable end.

Attached to the south facade is a two-story gable-roof kitchen wing with an interior chimney at the ridge at its south gable end. The cornice of this wing is not bracketed, and the gable end is not clipped. There is a small basement under the kitchen wing. Attached to the east of the wing is a one-story two-bay addition (probably an enclosed porch) which now houses the kitchen appliances.

The house was probably built circa 1886, when Dr. Charles A. Fox purchased a town lot from John Simms, Beltsville's most prosperous merchant.¹ By 1868, Simms owned a tavern, sawmill, storehouse, shoeshop and six rental properties, as well as his residence, farm, and a considerable amount of undeveloped land west of St. John's Episcopal Church.² Dr. Fox, a physician from Virginia who since 1869 had lived and practiced in Vansville, purchased a 2-9/16 acre lot which adjoined the Episcopal cemetery on the west. The house was probably built within that year; the doctor's office (east wing) may have been added around the turn of the century.

Dr. Fox was for many years not only the village doctor for Beltsville, but was also active in a variety of civic affairs, particularly in road building and improvement; he was chairman in 1900 of a committee to improve the Washington-Baltimore Turnpike.⁴ He died in 1915, and his family continued to occupy the house until 1923;⁵ it is still locally known as the "Dr. Fox House".

In the last half century, during the residence of the Coffin and Beebe families, the Dr. Fox House has seen alterations and expansion. It is, however, a noticeable and unique landmark in the historic town of Beltsville.

Interior of the main block consists of a stairhall on the east, and a long parlor (originally a double parlor) on the west. The staircase has a heavy turned newel and turned balusters. There is a plaster ceiling medallion in the stairhall. A door at the foot of the staircase leads to the west into the long parlor; a second door from the hall into the rear (south) section of the parlor has been structurally closed. There is a (modern) brick fireplace off center in the south wall of the parlor. Door and window surrounds in the main block have wide ovolo moldings.

The one-story east wing consists of one room which once served as a doctor's office. Door and window surrounds have multi-band moldings and bullseye corner blocks, and the walls are panelled with narrow wainscoting.




