Prepare both a summary paragraph and a general description of the resource and its various elements as it exists today.

The Dodge-Klein House, c. 1898, is an excellent example of turn of the century suburban vernacular architecture. The building is in excellent condition with many interior details intact. It was constructed by a Mr. Little of Hyattsville, who is also credited with building the house neighboring to the north. A special carpenter was brought in to build the staircase. Located on Lot 7 and part of Lot 1 in Block 53 on Cleveland Avenue, it was one of the earliest houses to be built in Riverdale Park. It is two stories high plus attic with a gable roof and cement foundation. The roof is finished with asphalt tiles, c. 1911. While originally constructed of clapboards, the house is currently finished with a modern vinyl siding. All major windows are two-light double hung sash with louvered shutters. The main facade, which faces west, is four bays wide. A porch extends the full width of this facade and is protected by a gently sloping roof supported by modern posts. There is no railing. The two right bays project slightly and are capped with a gable top. The second story has windows located in the three right bays and the attic level has a small four-light window. The gable ends have two bay openings each and various window openings. They are otherwise unremarkable. The rear (east) facade is interrupted with a number of modern additions. The first story has a kitchen addition (c.1915) to the south and an enclosed porch on the north. Centered on the second floor is a small square extension which makes up the bath. The original barn sits just to the south of the house at the rear of the property. It is a one story plus attic structure with a gable roof and was built by Mr. Dodge, the original owner of the house. The interior of the house is a four room plan with side stair. The kitchen was originally located in the northeast room, but was moved to a wing addition, c. 1915. The second floor consists of three rooms plus a stair hall. See attached photos.

Prepare both a summary paragraph of significance and a general statement of history and support.

The Dodge-Klein House, situated along the tracks of the Baltimore and Ohio Railroad, was one of the earliest houses to be built in Riverdale Park. Original tax assessments value the lot at \$200 and the improvement at \$800. It is featured in the c. 1904 guide book of the town (see attached photo). Also featured in this same photo (north of the Dodge home) is the residence of Charles Kerfoot. He was Mrs. Helen Dodge's brother and is the individual who encouraged the Dodge's to settle in Riverdale. In the mid-1890's Mr. and Mrs. Dodge (then engaged) would make Sunday bicycle trips from Washington to visit Helen's brother and his family. The house immediately to the south of the Dodge's, which is no longer extant, was also built by relatives of Mrs. Dodge. Like most Riverdale residents, Mr. Dodge commuted to work in Washington. In early years, the Dodge's would board up the house in winter and only live in the Riverdale house full-time during the summer months. The house today remains in the possession of the Dodge family.
