Description:

The Mt. Rainier United Methodist Church is a two-part building, the whole having an "L" shaped plan. The rectangular north wing, constructed of random stone, dates to 1924. The south brick wing, set perpendicular to the north wing, dates to 1955. The older block is three bays on its north, main gable end. Three double entrance doors are set high above street level, reached by a flight of stairs approaching from the east and west to the high entry porch. The doors are surmounted by a rectangular transom, a wide frieze with a heavy crown-molded cornice, and a rectangular stone tablet. The porch and entrance doors are sheltered by a two-story portico supported on Tuscan Doric columns, surmounted by an entablature and a triangular pediment with a centered circular window. Located at the northwest corner of the facade is a corner stone engraved "Mt. Rainier M.E. Church South 1924." The east and west facades have three high round-arch stained glass windows. The long, brick circa 1955 wing is attached to the main block at the south end. The wing is three stories in height, three bays on the east and west-facing gable ends, by eight bays on the long south side. A high bell tower is attached where the southeast corner of the main block meets the brick wing. The bell tower has a two-story square brick base with a round-arch double entry door in the north facade.

Significance

The Mt. Rainier United Methodist Church is significant for its monumental, Classical Revival architecture. It is an institution in the community, both for its long history there and for the prominence of its structure. The congregation began meeting in 1903, as a mission of the Hyattsville Methodist Episcopal Church. The church incorporated in 1919 as the Mt. Rainier Methodist Episcopal Church South, and acquired the lot at the corner of Bunker Hill and 35th Streets from John C. Yost. In 1924 construction began on a permanent structure, with Rossel E. Mitchell of Washington, D.C. as the architect. The building is outstanding for its blue-grey, random fieldstone walls, its monumental entrance portico and large, round-arch stained glass windows. In 1955 the brick wing was added to the south of the stone structure, more than doubling its size.

The Mt. Rainier United Methodist Church is a two-part building, the whole having an "L" shaped plan. The north wing, rectangular in plan, constructed of random laid stone, dates to 1924. The south brick wing, rectangular in plan, set perpendicular to the north wing, dates to 1955.

The church stands on the northeast corner of the intersection of Bunker Hill and 35th Streets. The older main block is three bays on its north, main gable end. Three double entrance doors are set high above street level and are reached by a flight of stairs approaching from the east and west to the high entry porch in front of the doors. The doors are surmounted by a rectangular transom, and a wide frieze with a heavy crown-molded cornice. There is a rectangular stone tablet above each door, and at second story level, a 1/1 double-hung sash stained glass window.

The porch and entrance doors are sheltered by a two-story portico supported on Tuscan Doric columns and surmounted by an entablature and a triangular pediment with a centered circular window. The pediment, and the upper gable on the main block are enclosed by a modillioned cornice and the wall surface is stuccoed. Located at the northwest corner of the facade, at approximately five feet above foundation level is a corner stone, engraved "Mt. Rainier M.E. Church South 1924."

The two-story ca. 1924 block is laid in roughly finished, random fieldstone, with convex mortar joints. The gable roof is slate covered. The modillioned cornice continues on the east and west sides of the building.

The four bay east facade has three high round-arch stained glass windows. Corresponding small rectangular windows are set at foundation level. There is a side-entry in the north bay. The five bay west facade is similar to the east with the exception of an extra south bay of 6/6 sash windows at foundation, first and second story level.

The long, brick circa 1955 wing is set perpendicular to the main block, attached to it at the south end. The wing is three stories in height, with a gable, slate roof. It is three bays on the east and west-facing gable ends, by eight bays on the long south side. Windows are 6/6 sash, surmounted by flat arches.

A high bell tower is attached where the southeast corner of the main block meets the brick wing. The bell tower has a two-story square brick base with a round-arch double entry door in the north facade. A heavy modillioned cornice encircles the tower above the second story. It is surmounted by a small rectangular wooden tower, with round-arch louvered openings flanked by pilasters and surmounted by a triangular pediment, in each face. The tower has a circular top section with a domed cap surmounted by a cross.

The church yard is encircled by a low retaining wall of the same fieldstone as the main block, surmounted by castellations. A large asphalt parking lot is to the south (rear) of the building. The rectory, a brick, ca. 1920's building, is south of the parking lot, fronting on 35th Street.

The sanctuary is a large rectangular room located in the original main block, and takes up the majority of the main floor. The curving pews, in a double row facing south, to the altar, are original. The wainscoting, of vertical rectangular panels, stained the same color as the pews, is also original. The wide, one-step surround around the stained glass windows is of the same wood. A curved balcony at the north end of the room echoes the curve of the pews. The high ceiling has an elaborate plaster cornice. Tudor-arch brass lantern fixtures hang from the ceiling. Two flat, rectangular pilasters flank the high rectangular opening over the altar.

The Mt. Rainier United Methodist Church is significant for its monumental, Classical Revival architecture. It is an institution in the community, both for its long history there and for the prominence of its structure.

The congregation began meeting in 1903, as a mission of the Hyattsville Methodist Episcopal Church, and met in a barn at what is now 37th and Upshur Streets in Mt. Rainier through 1916. In that year 26 congregants signed a petition to the Methodist Bishop of Maryland, requesting permission to reorganize as a self-supporting congregation, separate from the Hyattsville Church. The reorganized congregation, taking the name of Mt. Rainier Methodist, worshipped at Potts Hall (now Star Hall) on Rhode Island Avenue, through June 1916. They met in a tent through the summer of 1916 on the lot at Bunker Hill and 35th Streets where they eventually built their permanent building. A temporary wooden structure was constructed on the site that fall.

The church incorporated in 1919 as the Mt. Rainier Methodist Episcopal Church South, and acquired the 26,374 square foot lot at the northeast corner of Bunker Hill and 35th Streets from John C. Yost.¹ The lot is located in the subdivision called Yost's Addition to Mt. Rainier.²

In 1924 the congregation had reached 447 adult members, and construction began on a permanent church structure. Rosel E. Mitchell of Washington, D.C. was the architect commissioned. The builder was R.E. Milor and Company and the stone contractor Jaeger and Minchillo.³ The building constructed is outstanding for its blue-grey, random fieldstone walls, its monumental entrance portico and large, round-arch stained glass windows.

In 1955, with a congregation numbering near 800, the brick wing was added to the south of the original stone structure, more than doubling its size. The brick wing is also monumental in design and scale, being three stories in height, with a high southeast bell tower. The wing is in

Colonial Revival style, its bell tower with domed cap and pedimented cornice, 6/6 sash windows, returned cornice, centered circular windows in the gable ends, and slate gable roof all 20th century interpretations of Colonial style elements.

The Mt. Rainier United Methodist Church presently has a congregation of 180 members. It is opening its well maintained facility for use as a day care center and offices for local non-profit organizations, as a way to continue to serve its institutional function in the community.⁴


