Description:

The Mangold House is a frame gable-roofed dwelling, situated on the east side of Cipriano Road and consisting of a two-story two-bay-by-one-bay main block built of logs, with a rear kitchen wing set at right angles, making the building T-shaped. Entrance is in the second bay of the two-bay west facade. A central cross-gable pierces the west plane of the roof; it is filled with two long eight-pane windows which are the only openings on the second story of the west facade. Across the west facade is a one-story hip-roofed porch, supported by sapling posts. There is a corbelled brick chimney centered at the ridge. The main block is sided with fish-scale shingles, painted light beige; corner posts and trim are painted brown. The roof has a deep overhang; foundations of the main block are of local iron-bearing stone. Centered on the east facade, and extending to the rear is a two-story one-bay gable-roofed kitchen wing. It is covered with German siding painted light beige. Foundations of the wing appear to be of concrete.

Significance

The Mangold House exemplifies the evolution of a simple type of folk housing into an attractive landmark in a suburban residential community. The main block of the house was constructed in 1894 by Charles Mangold on an acre of land, located in an undeveloped area known as Good Luck. A carpenter by trade, Mangold constructed for his family a one-and-one-half-story four-room (two up, two down) hall-and-parlor log house. Circa 1920, Mangold expanded his house by building the rear wing, and it was probably at this time that the central cross-gable was added, raising the roof to a full two stories. The log house was then covered with fish-scale shingles, cut from wood on the lot. Descendants of Charles Mangold still own the house. Development has changed the area into a community made up of modern dwellings, and the Mangold House is a noticeable landmark among them.

The Mangold House is a frame gable-roofed dwelling, situated on the east side of Cipriano (formerly Telegraph) Road, in a community of new single-family houses. There is a kitchen-garden behind the house, and the large (one-acre) lot is wooded at the rear. The house consists of a two-story two-bay-by-one-bay main block built of logs, with a rear kitchen wing set at right angles, making the building T-shaped. Entrance is in the second bay of the two-bay west (main) facade. A central cross-gable pierces the west plane of the roof; it is filled with two long eight-pane windows which are the only openings on the second story of the west facade. Across the west facade is a one-story hip-roofed porch, supported by sapling posts. There is a corbelled brick chimney centered at the ridge. The main block is sided with fish-scale shingles, painted light beige; two rows of rectangular shingles form a string course at the eaves on the north and south gable ends. Corner posts and trim (including the plain board surrounds of doors and windows) are painted brown. Windows are generally 6/6 double hung sash. The roof has a deep overhang; it is covered with green asphalt shingle. The same shingle is used for siding of the central cross-gable. Foundations of the main block are of local iron-bearing stone.

Centered on the east facade, and extending to the rear is a two-story one-bay gable-roofed kitchen wing. It is covered with German siding painted light beige, and has an interior chimney at the east end of the ridge. Foundations of the wing appear to be of concrete. There is a one-story shed-roof porch across the east (rear) gable end.

Directly behind the house is a well, and a short distance to the east is a modern board-and-batten gable-roofed shed. There are several other small sheds at the rear of the lot.

The Mangold House exemplifies the evolution of a simple type of folk housing into an attractive landmark in a suburban residential community. The main block of the house was constructed in 1894 by Charles Mangold on an acre of land which he purchased in that year from the Wesley family.<sup>1</sup> This land was located in an undeveloped area known as Good Luck, at the westernmost edge of the Bowie Election District. Mangold, a carpenter by trade, constructed for his family a one-and-one-half-story four-room (two up, two down) hall-and-parlor log house.

Circa 1920, Mangold expanded his house by building the rear wing, and it was probably at this time that the central cross-gable was added, raising the roof to a full two stories. The log house was then covered with fish-scale shingles, cut from wood on the lot.<sup>2</sup>

In 1963, Annie Mangold, widow of Charles Mangold, deeded the house and one-acre lot to her daughter, Rose Griffin.<sup>3</sup> It is still owned by Mrs. Griffin, but has been occupied by tenants since that time. The 1960's and 1970's have seen considerable development in this area, largely influenced by the establishment of Goddard Space Flight Center (NASA) a short distance to the north. The surrounding community is now made up of modern dwellings, and the Mangold House is a noticeable landmark among them.
