<p>The house is built in several sections, the earliest being a story and a half frame house, sheathed with random width beaded clapboards. The three bay facade has a central doorway and flanking 9/9 double hung sash; dormer windows are casements with eight lights in each leaf. On the west end is an external chimney and on the east end, a large internal chimney. The west gable end has four 9/9 double hung sash windows on the first floor and two 6/6 double hung sash on the second. The east gable end has two windows, both four lights, irregularly postioned.</p> <p>The additions on the east end are a gabled facade, three bay, story and a half block connected to the main house by a single story passageway.</p> <p>There is a Mullican family cemetery near the house; the oldest stone dates from the 1830's.</p>

Mulliken's Delight was originally a 20-foot square frame cottage erected late in the 17th century by James Mulliken. Before 1750, a 28 foot square, two-story house was built west of the cottage, and became the main dwelling; it was connected to the original cottage by a room-size passage. Later dormers were added, and a four columned shed-roofed porch built on to the front (south) facade of the main house. A massive segmental arched fireplace dominates the living room of the main portion: supporting beams and floor boards of the exposed ceiling are beaded, and doors and moldings of this section date from the early 18th century. The house was restored during the 1930's; a family graveyard is located a short distance northwest of the house.

Six succeeding generations of James Mullikens lived in "Mulliken's Delight" from 1697 to 1881. Related by blood and marriage to many prominent P.G. County families, the Mullikens maintained their family plantation at "The Levels" a 300-acre tract patented by James Mulliken (I) in 1696. Most notable of the Jameses was the fourth, a Captain of the Maryland Militia during the Revolution. After the war he was appointed County Court Justice for several terms. His will, probated in 1804, directed that his extensive land holdings be divided equally among his sons, James (V) receiving the home plantation and additional acreage which he had resurveyed in 1811 as "Mulliken's Delight". After his sudden death in 1816, his sons were awarded a patent for the property. The elder son, James (VI), lived at "Mulliken's Delight", until bankruptcy forced the sale of the property in 1881. With his death in 1886, the direct male line of James Mulliken (I) came to an end.

**DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE**

Mulliken's Delight was originally a 20 foot square frame cottage with a loft, erected late in the 17th century by James Mulliken. Before 1750, a 28 foot square two story frame structure with two dormers on the entrance facade was built to the west, with a 16 foot square passage connecting the two parts. A portion of the original roof, visible in an attic crawl space, was preserved when the middle section was attached to the smaller house. After 1798 the larger structure was extended six feet to the rear and two rear dormers were added. A large shed-roofed pantry was attached to the middle section. The main house has a shed-roofed front porch supported by four wooden columns, which dates from at least 1804.

The interior features a massive five foot segmental arched fireplace in the "Great Room" of the main building (the 28 foot square section), with a staircase to the second floor which winds behind it. Both the floor boards and supporting beams of the exposed ceiling are beaded. Sash mintins date from 1730-50 and the door and molding are possibly earlier. A second chimney is set off center with the gable to the rear on the northwest of the main house. Two other chimneys, one in the smaller section, have been removed. Moldings in the smaller section have been replaced.

A family graveyard is located a short distance from the house. The earliest remaining stone dates from 1816, but there are undoubtedly earlier lost gravesites.

## STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

Six succeeding generations of James Mullikens lived at "Mulliken's Delight" from 1697 to 1881. Built on land patented in 1698,<sup>1</sup> the house was enlarged by 1798 to three sections: 20 feet square, 16 feet square, and 28 feet square; with minor changes "Mulliken's Delight" today is identical to the 1798 Federal Tax description.

Related by blood and marriage to many prominent P.G. County families, the Mullikens maintained their home plantation at "The Levels" while acquiring additional acreage in the area. Most notable of the James was the fourth, who served as Captain in the Maryland Militia during the Revolution. After the war, he was appointed County Court Justice for several terms. His will, probated in 1804,<sup>2</sup> directed the equal division of his real estate among his sons, James V receiving the home plantation and additional acreage which he had resurveyed as "Mulliken's Delight" in 1811. His son, James VI, lost the property in a bankruptcy sale in 1881.

A family graveyard is located a short distance from the house. The earliest remaining stone dates from 1816, but there are undoubtedly earlier lost gravesites.




