DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This is a very overgrown cemetery, in a wooded grove near Rte. 214-east of Church Rd. A 1/8 acre burial plot, enclosed in an iron fence, contains the graves of several Bowie family members. Their home "Friendship" stood near here. Reportedly, the graves have been moved since 1972. (See BOWIE for names of those buried here.)

Aug. 14, 1980

The State Archeologist reported that the graves in the Bowie Family Cemetery were moved in 1975 to St. Barnabas Church on Oak Grove Road.


