Description

The Marshall-Walters House is set back from but faces Woodyard Road. It has a two story, rectangular, three-by-one-bay frame gable roof main block with a small two story, three-by-one-bay rectangular east wing. Entrance to the main block is in the first bay of the three bay south (main) facade, through a door with a six light transom and four light sidelights. Brick veneer covers the first story, horizontal wood siding the second. There is an entrance porch across the facade. A boxed cornice with crown molding is just above the three second story windows. The north (rear) facade is three bays, the third bay a rear entrance shaded by a one bay entrance porch. The east gable end of the main block has a high exterior corbelled brick chimney. The east wing projects from the east facade of the main block. Its south (entrance) facade has three irregular bays. The central entrance is flanked by two 1/1 windows on each floor. The plain wood cornice is flush with the wall surface. The roof has a more shallow slope than that of the main block. The east facade of the wing has an exterior corbelled brick chimney with weathering. The two bay north (rear) facade is flush with the wall of the main block. The present owner has added brick veneer and altered the fenestration. The stairway in the main block has a finished baluster and stair to the third floor, although the roof on the third floor is so low one cannot stand up.

Significance

The Marshall-Walters House is located on what was a part of the His Lordship's Kindness estate. One hundred and eighty-eight acres, called the Bellefonte Mill Lot, were sold to Richard H. Marshall in 1851. The main block and the wing were probably completed by 1876, when the Marshall heirs were assessed taxes of \$1,000 on the house and \$1,250 on a brick mill located east of the house. Marshall and his son William ran the mill from 1851 to 1878. It then was sold to James Walters, who ran a saw and grist mill through 1903. The mill was visible on maps through 1936. The house is significant for its history and for its two part plan. The east, earlier wing is notable for its irregular fenestration and lack of detail. The main block has regular fenestration, a handsome entranceway and a hall and double parlor plan typical of ca. 1850's plantation houses in the County. The west wing was more imposing with its high gable roof, lowered in the 1950's. The building has some original mantels and interior woodwork.

Prepare both a summary paragraph and a general description of the resource and its various elements as it exists today.

The Marshall-Walters House is set on a five acre lot, north of Woodyard Road. The house is set back from but faces the road. It has a two story, rectangular, three-by-one-bay frame gable roof main block with a small two story, three-by-one-bay rectangular wing on its east side.

Entrance to the main block is in the first bay of the three bay south (main) facade. The entrance is a modern door with a six light transom and four light sidelights. The second bay is a modern bay window added by the present owner. Brick veneer covers the first story. The second story is covered with horizontal siding. There is an asphalt shingled, hipped roof entrance porch across the facade, with a wide frieze, and overhanging eaves with projecting rafters, supported on square wood posts. The second story has three 1/1 double hung sash windows with plain wood surrounds. There is a boxed cornice with crown molding, just above the second story windows.

The west facade of the main block is one bay, composed of a 1/1 window on the first and second stories. The north (rear) facade is three bays, the first two composed of 1/1 windows on the first and second floors. The third bay is a rear entrance shaded by a one bay gable entrance porch with square wood posts.

The east facade of the main block is covered with brick veneer and has a high exterior rectangular corbelled brick chimney south of the gable ridge.

The east wing projects from the east facade of the main block, and is set back from the front elevation of the main block. The south (entrance) facade is three irregularly spaced bays, the first two being closer to each other than the third. There is a central entrance flanked by two new 1/1 windows on each floor. There is a plain wood cornice flush with the wall surface. The roof has a more shallow slope than that of the main block. The foundation is brick and the entrance facade is covered with brick veneer.

The east facade of the wing has an exterior corbelled brick chimney with weathering at the first story level. The north (rear) facade is flush with the wall of the main block. It is two bays with two 1/1 windows on the second story. There is a one story shed roof addition on the north east corner of the first story. The second bay is a modern sliding glass door. The modern fenestration and brick veneer have been added by the owner since 1981.

The Marshall-Walters House is a two-part structure, located on what was a part of the His Lordship's Kindness estate. One hundred and eighty-eight acres, called the Bellefonte Mill Lot, were sold to Richard H. Marshall in 1851.¹ The east wing of the Marshall-Walters house was probably constructed at this time. The main block was probably completed by 1876, when the Richard H. Marshall heirs were assessed taxes of \$1,000 on the house. The property had on it at that time a brick mill, assessed at \$1,250.² The mill was located some distance to the east of the house, on Piscataway Creek.³ Richard H. Marshall, and later his son William, ran the mill from 1851 to 1878. It was sold at that time to James Walters, also a miller. Walters and his son ran a saw and grist mill through 1903, when the property was leased to the Maryland Oil and Development Company.⁴ The mill and mill race were visible on topographic maps through 1936.⁵ There is no longer evidence of a mill on the site.

The house is significant for its history and for its two part plan. The east, earlier wing is notable for its irregular fenestration simple entranceway and lack of stylistic detail. The main block has regular fenestration, a handsome entranceway and the hall and double parlor plan common in plantation houses built during the 1850's and 60's in the County. The west wing was more imposing with its high gable roof, which was lowered early in the 1950's. Both wings have some original mantels and interior woodwork. Although the building has had altered fenestration and exterior wall covering its original appearance and period of construction are evident.

To the east is a lower, two story wing with a three bay facade. It has a central doorway and flanking 6/6 double hung sash windows. On the east end is a large, external one-story chimney base with brick stack.

The present siding is asbestos.
