Description:

The Marlow/Huntt Store and J.E. Huntt Casket Shop/Tenant House were previously individually surveyed by the Maryland-National Capital Park and Planning Commission (M-NCPPC) in 1974, by the Prince George's County Historic Preservation Commission in 1985, and as part of the addendum to the T.B. Historic District form by P.A.C Spero & Company in 1996. Since the time of the previous survey, the store and casket shop are unaltered. However, these two buildings were historically as well as currently located on the same tax parcel, and therefore are being included together as one property. There are also two outbuildings on the property which were not described in the previous surveys.

The first outbuilding is a modern, 1-story, gambrel-roof pre-fabricated shed. It is of wood-frame construction with vertical-grooved siding and asphalt shingles on the roof. It is located to the east of the store building.

The second outbuilding is a circa 1910 shed. It is of wood-frame construction with a shed roof. The building is covered in vertical-board siding and the roof is covered in corrugated metal. The building is on concrete piers. There is a single door-opening on the north elevation, but the door is missing. There are shelves on the interior of the shed. It is located to the east of the store and the first shed, at the edge of a fence.


The fence separates the Marlow/Huntt Store from the rear of the J.E. Huntt Casket Shop/Tenant House.

National Register Eligibility:


The Marlow/Huntt Store and J.E. Huntt Casket Shop/Tenant House were previously evaluated for National Register eligibility as contributing elements in a T.B. Historic District. The eligibility of the T.B. area is being reconsidered due to the limited number of resources surviving in the village. The individual properties which were considered contributing are being re-evaluated on an individual basis. The Marlow/Huntt Store and the J.E. Huntt Casket Shop/Tenant House, constructed in 1867 and 1878 respectively, are eligible for the National Register of Historic Places under Criteria A and C, as excellent examples of mid-to-late-nineteenth century commercial buildings associated with the development of the crossroads community of T.B. The buildings are eligible under Criterion A for their association with the commercial development of T.B. The store was constructed in 1867 as the first commercial building at the current center of T.B. An earlier store building was located to the west of the current village center. The store building was used as the general store and post-office during the peak period of T.B.'s development. The casket shop is an unusual known example of a commercial building used for specialized functions, including a casket shop and meeting space. The buildings are eligible under Criterion C as excellent examples of vernacular commercial architecture. The buildings have excellent integrity, retaining their original windows, siding and trim. The property is not eligible under Criterion B, as research has indicated no association with persons who have made a specific contribution to history. Finally, preliminary studies conducted for this project indicate the need for further assessment of the archaeological potential of this property. Therefore, no evaluation under Criterion D is being conducted at this time.



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

Description:

The Marlow/Huntt Store Building was previously surveyed by the Maryland-National Capital Park and Planning Commission (M-NCPPC) in 1974 and by the Prince George's County Historic Preservation Commission in 1985. Since the time of the previous survey, the property is unaltered.

National Register Evaluation:

The Marlow/Huntt Store Building is eligible for the National Register of Historic Places, as a contributing element in the Tee Bee Historic District. The Tee Bee Historic District is eligible for the National Register of Historic Places under Criteria A and C and the store represents an excellent example of rural commercial architecture in southern Prince George's County. In addition, the building is a prominent marker of the late-nineteenth century crossroads community. The district meets Criterion A as representative of the society and economy of a late-nineteenth century crossroads community. Extant structures in the town, including the store, a casket shop and several residences which date to the period of significance, remain as characteristic features of a town which grew as a result of its location at the intersection of the Washington-Charles County Road and the Brandywine-Piscataway Road. The community is eligible under Criterion C, due to the presence of examples of mid-nineteenth century, rural vernacular architecture and later Folk Victorian structures. The five (5) contributing buildings within the historic district have good integrity of materials and the community retains much of the feeling of a small crossroads village.



Description:

The Antique Store is a two-story frame gable-roofed building with the principal facade being its north gable end. Entrance is in the central bay of this three-bay north gable end, through a double door with three vertical panes in each door. A one-story shed-roof porch runs across the gable end. Two flanking windows are 6/6 and have panelled shutters. There is a six-pane round-arched window at loft level above the double doors, and large decorative brackets adorn the deep overhang of the cornice. The building is covered with German siding, the roof is of corrugated tin, and the foundations are concrete. At second level in the south (rear) gable end, there are two large 6/6 windows which pierce the raking cornices. Two asymmetrical one-story additions have been built onto the rear of the building. The interior of the main block is one large room, now used as an antique store.

Significance:

The Antique Store is an excellent example of rural commercial architecture in southern Prince George's County. Located at the crossroads of the Brandywine and Accokeek Roads, it is a landmark in the village of T.B. It was constructed by A. W. Marlow in 1867 as a general store. In 1876 the store was purchased by J. Eli Huntt, who operated there a post office and a dealership in dry goods, groceries, patent medicines, shoes, paints, hardware, fancy goods and hats. After his death in 1897, the store continued to be operated by members of his family until 1957, and ownership remains with his descendants to the present day. With the exception of the two rear additions and the one-story porch, the store has undergone little change since its construction.

The Antique Store is a two-story frame gable-roofed building (ca. 22' x 36') with the principal facade being its north gable end. Entrance is through the central bay of this three-bay north gable end, through a double door with three vertical panes in each door. The door opens out onto a one-story shedroof porch (not original) which runs across the gable end, and the double door itself is sheltered by an enclosed entry vestibule constructed on the porch. The two flanking windows are 6/6, and have panelled shutters. There is a six-pane round-arched window at loft level above the double doors, and large decorative brackets adorn the deep overhang of the cornice. The building is covered with German siding, the roof is of corrugated tin, and there is a concrete foundation. There is an exterior (stove) chimney located near the center of the west side of the building. At second story in the south (rear) gable end, there are two large 6/6 windows which pierce the raking cornices. Two asymmetrical one-story additions have been built onto the rear of the building.

The interior of the original building is one large room, now used as an antique store.

The Antique Store is an excellent example of rural commercial architecture in southern Prince George's County. The two-story frame gable-roofed building has undergone little change since its construction as a general store in 1867.

Located directly on the crossroads of old Tee Bee Road (now Old Brandywine Road) and Route 373 (Accokeek Road), the Antique Store remains a significant centrally-located landmark in the village of T.B. It was constructed in 1867 by A.W. Marlow as a general store for his brother-in-law, Samuel Turner, who operated it until 1876. In October of that year, J. Eli Huntt, a prosperous businessman and landowner in T.B., purchased the store and the one-acre parcel of land from A.W. Marlow. Until that time, Huntt had been operating a store and post office at his residence property in T. B.¹ Huntt relocated his store and post office to the newly purchased store and began a larger operation as a "Dealer in Dry Goods and Groceries, Patent Medicines, Boots, Shoes, Paints, Oils, Glass, Dye Stuffs, Hardware, Fancy Goods, Hats, Caps, etc."² J.E. Huntt successfully operated his store and post office and built on a rear addition for feed and grain.

After Huntt's death in 1897, his former clerk, W.E. Boswell, operated the store until 1908 when he completed construction on a larger store across the road. The old store was subsequently operated by H. Bruce Burroughs, J.E. Huntt's son-in-law, while owned by Huntt's widow. By 1911 Burroughs added the second rear addition as a shoe shop. In 1934, his son, E. Huntt Burroughs took over until his retirement in 1957. From that time to the present, several lessees, including the current antique dealer, have operated various businesses in the old store. Ownership of the store has remained, to the present, with the descendants of J.E. Huntt.³

With the exception of the two rear additions and the one-story shed-roof porch which runs across the north gable end, little has changed to alter the original construction in 1867.⁴

Visible from the Route 5 bypass constructed during the 1950's, the Antique Store represents the commercial center and focal point of a nineteenth century crossroads community typical of southern Prince George's County.



In the gable is a double hung sash window with a semi-circular head. The double front doors have flush panels as do the window shutters. On the rear is a lean-to addition with double doors.




