**Description:**

The Talbert House was previously surveyed by the Maryland-National Capital Park and Planning Commission (M-NCPPC) in 1974 and by the Prince George's County Historic Preservation Commission in 1985. Since the time of the previous survey, the house has been demolished. A new 1-story residence has been constructed at the site of the house. The barn and two sheds noted in previous surveys remain extant. Inspection of the condition of the barn and sheds was not possible, as access to the property is restricted by a locked gate.

**National Register Evaluation:**

The Talbert House was a wood-frame residence, constructed circa 1870. However, the house is no longer extant. Therefore, the Talbert House is not eligible for the National Register of Historic Places, as research conducted indicates no association with any historic events or trends significant in the development of national, state or local history. Historic research indicates that the property has no association with persons who have made specific contributions to history, and therefore, it does not meet Criterion B. Although a barn and two sheds remain on the property, it is not eligible under Criterion C. The outbuildings are undistinctive examples of agricultural buildings, and the feeling and setting of the property has been altered through the construction of a new residence. Finally, the property has no known potential to yield important information, and therefore, is not eligible under Criterion D.





Description

The Talbert house is a gable-roofed frame dwelling which stands in an open field southeast of the Popes Creek railroad line near Cheltenham. It consists of a one-and-one-half-story main block, five-bays by one-bay, with a rear kitchen wing. There are two entrances in the north main facade, in the first and fourth bays, and there is a one-story hip-roofed porch with plain posts across the facade. There is a corbelled brick chimney at the ridge between the second and third bays. A slight bulge at the ridge near the chimney suggests that the two eastern bays may have been added to an already existing three-bay dwelling with end chimney. Windows are 2/2 double hung sash and some have shutters. There are no windows at second level, but the pitch of the roof suggests that there is loft space. Extending south, flush with the west gable end of the main block, is a one-story ell wing, with ridgeline perpendicular to that of the main block. The entire building is sheathed with German siding painted yellow. The roof is of tin, but covered in places with tar paper. Foundations could not be observed. Directly east of the dwelling are two small gable-roofed sheds; farther to the east is a gable-roofed barn.

Significance

The Talbert house is a good example of a modest vernacular dwelling of the railroad era in Prince George's County. Although it was not accessible for examination at the time of this survey, it appears that the original structure was a simple one-and-one-half-story hall-and-parlor plan dwelling, to which an easterly room was added at a later time. This was the dwelling in the 1860's of Paul and Matilda Talbert; it stood on a 63-acre part of a tract called Finches Discovery. The Talbert's small vernacular dwelling, increased to its present size, was sold with 15 acres in the 1890's. For most of the twentieth century it has been the residence and farm of the Hall family. It stands in open farmland, a reminder of the plain folk architecture of nineteenth century Prince George's County.

The Talbert house is a good example of a modest vernacular dwelling of the railroad era in Prince George's County. Although it was not accessible for examination at the time of this survey, it appears that the original structure was a simple one-and-one-half-story hall-and-parlor plan dwelling, to which an easterly room was added at a later time.

This was the dwelling in the 1860's of Paul and Matilda Talbert; it stood on a 63-acre part of a tract called Finches Discovery.<sup>1</sup> This rural section of the Nottingham District was much changed by the construction of the Baltimore and Potomac Railroad line in the 1870's. The cross-roads community of Brandywine to the south developed into a thriving commercial village, the population in the area increased, and the new Brandywine Election district was formed. The small railroad community of Cheltenham developed near the Cheltenham station just a short distance north of the Talbert's house. Members of the Talbert family continued to farm land in this area, and early twentieth century maps show a small community called Talbert 1/2 mile south of Cheltenham.

The Talbert's small vernacular dwelling, by now probably increased to its present size, was sold with 15 acres in the 1890's. For most of the twentieth century it has been the residence and farm of the Hall family.<sup>2</sup> It stands in open farmland, a reminder of the plain folk architecture of nineteenth century Prince George's County.






