Description

Mattaponi is a large brick three-part dwelling originally covered with stucco, the central block, veneered ca. 1950's in Flemish bond, has two stories, a hip roof and flanking double interior chimneys on east and west. One story brick wings with hip roofs extend from the east and west sides; each has flanking double chimneys corresponding to those on the central block. The southeast chimney on the main block is false, constructed to maintain design symmetry. The south facade has been altered from five bays to three, the original five bays remain on the north. The house stands on a hilltop with a panoramic view of the surrounding property including an 18th century and two 20th century barns, a pond, a cemetery and a mill site.

Significance

Traditionally, Mattaponi was the birth place of Robert Bowie, (1750-1818) Governor of Maryland 1803-06 and 1811-12, but this has not been proven. A house is known to have existed on the site before 1739, when Court records refer to it. The present house is a ca. 1820's reconstruction on the foundation of an earlier structure, with Federal and Greek Revival style moldings, mantels and stair. Mattaponi was the home of Robert William Bowie, four times a State Delegate and three times a State Senator, through 1848. Bowie probably completed the house reconstruction when he acquired the property after his father's death in 1818. It was sold from the Bowie family in 1868 and has been held by a series of owners since that time. In 1986 it was purchased by the Archdiocese of Washington for use as a camp and retreat center.

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

Mattaponi (an Indian word meaning "meeting of waters") is a large, brick, three-part house situated on a high hill above the Patuxent Valley. The central block, in Flemish bond, is two stories high and has a hip roof. The south front has been altered from five bays to three, now having large three-part windows. The north or rear facade has the original five bays. All of the windows have flat brick arches. The main entrance is recessed beneath a curved arch. Delicate tracery decorates the fanlight and sidelights. There are two interior chimney stacks near the eaves on the east and west sides. One-story brick wings with hip roofs extend from the east and west sides of the main block, each with a pair of interior chimneys placed to correspond with those in the larger section. The oldest part appears to be the cellar under the west wing which could have been a separate structure before the rest of the house was built.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

Mattaponi is located on part of the tract of land patented to Roger Brooke in 1680, named Brookes Reserve. In 1730 John Bowie bought the land and then deeded it to his son Captain William Bowie, father of Robert Bowie who was the Governor of Maryland from 1803 to 1806, and from 1811 to 1812. Traditionally, Governor Bowie was born here, however, this has not been proven. There has been a house located here since before 1739, when a Court record mentions Mattaponi House and the mill as landmarks in an old road description. Governor Bowie's 1818 inventory refers to his brick house which was not his main residence in the town of Nottingham. The inventory of his son Robert W. Bowie, in 1848, lists furnishings which correspond to the present rooms of Mattaponi. Since 1866, when the house was sold out of the Bowie family, it has had many owners.

Mattaponi (an Indian word meaning "meeting of waters") is a large brick three-part house; the central block is laid up in Flemish bond, has two stories, a hip roof and two interior chimneys on east and west. One story brick wings with hip roofs extend from the east and west sides; each has two interior chimneys corresponding to those on the central block. The south facade has been altered from five bays to three, but the original five bays remain on the north facade.

Mattaponi was the home of Robert Bowie, Governor of Maryland 1803-06 and 1811-12, who received the land from his father and grandfather. His grave is located near the house. Traditionally, Governor Bowie was born at Mattaponi, but this has not been proven. A house is known to have existed on the site before 1739, when a Court record refers to it, but the present house may be in part an early 19th century reconstruction.

Governor Bowie's descendants remained at Mattaponi until 1866, when it was finally sold out of the Bowie family.

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (if known) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE	
<p>The present house was built about 1815-20 to replace an earlier house of about the same dimensions; the house was stuccoed originally, but in the 1950's was veneered with brick to give it a Georgian appearance. The wings, however, were not veneered but the stucco has been removed and the brick was sand blasted. The chimneys--two on each end of the main block and two at the end of each wing--are still stuccoed and scored to look like stone.</p> <p>The facade is three bays with a central entrance. The doorway arch surrounds a classical revival frame of door and leaded glass sidelights and leaded fanlight; a transom bar between the fanlight and doorway is supported by engaged fluted columns between the door and sidelights. The flanking windows are three part, with jack arches of thin brick above; the central sash is 6/6 double hung, flanked by 4-light, non-moveable sash. The second floor windows are also three-part sash.</p> <p>The rear facade is five bays with a central doorway similar to that of the main facade. The windows are 6/6 double hung sash with wide wooden sills. A porch covers the three center bays.</p> <p>Each of the two wings is two bays with three-part windows.</p> <p>Above a shallow cornice is a low, hipped roof. In plan, the house has a T-plan hall running across the front and through the center of the house. The two rooms open off the center hall; the fireplaces are marble with Ionic entablature. The hallway has fluted columns and pilasters supporting a low segmental arch; the pilaster fluting is narrow. The doorway architraves have fluting and corner blocks; the door panels are shallow.</p> <p>Gov. Robert Bowie is buried near the house.</p>







FIRST FLOOR PLAN




BASEMENT FLOOR PLAN




