Description

The Old Baden School was enlarged early in the 20th century. It is now a rectangular two-story frame, gable roof structure. There is a seam on the east facade between the second and third bays where the addition to the one room, one-story school house was made. The two bay south gable end is the main facade. Entrance is through the first bay, the second is a 6/6 double hung sash window. The three bay, hipped roof entrance porch rests on square wood posts. The three bay east facade has 6/6 windows on the first and second stories. There is a plain boxed cornice throughout the building. An interior brick chimney is at the gable ridge, north of center. The roof is covered with standing-seam metal, the building sided with horizontal siding. It rests on brick piers. The north gable end is one bay with a parged brick interior chimney on the northwest corner. The three bay west facade has a projecting two-by-one bay, two-story shed roof northwest addition with an entrance sheltered by a two-bay shed roof porch. The old school is now used for storage. There is a grave to the northeast of the building. The stone reads "John Burke, died February 16, 1857, aged 67 years".

Significance

The Old Baden School is significant for its former use as a school and for its simple, vernacular architecture. The Baden School appears on the 1861 Martenet Map but not on the 1878 Hopkins Atlas. There were two other schools in the area in 1878, which may have lead to the closing of the Baden School. The building and one acre lot were sold by the Board of County School Commissioners to Margaret J. Skinner in 1913, Skinner listed on the 1900 U.S. Census as the wife of Frederick K. Skinner, farmer. It was probably after 1913 that the second story and north bay were added to the building. The Baden School building was a one-room, one-story rectangular structure with a gable end entrance. When it was enlarged as a residence its simple, utilitarian style was continued. The Baden School building is one of few such utilitarian structures to survive. The grave northeast of the school building is that of John Burke, listed on the 1850 U.S. Census as a planter and merchant, born in Ireland. He and his wife resided near the school from at least 1857 through 1878.

The Old Baden School was enlarged early in the twentieth century by the addition of a second story and a north bay. It is now a rectangular two-story frame, gable roof structure. There is a seam on the east facade between the second and third bays where the addition to the one room, one-story school house was made.

The two bay south gable end is the entrance facade. Entrance is through the first bay, the second is a 6/6 double hung sash window. There is one central 6/6 window on the second story. The three bay, hipped roof entrance porch has a boxed cornice. The roof rests on square wood posts.

The east facade has three bays, composed of 6/6 windows on the first and second stories. The windows have plain wood surrounds and wood sills. There is a plain boxed cornice throughout the building. There is an interior brick chimney at the gable ridge, north of the building's center. The roof is covered with standing-seam metal and the building is sided with horizontal siding. It rests on brick piers.

The north gable end is one bay, one 6/6 window on the first and one on the second stories. There is a parged brick interior chimney on the north-west corner of the facade.

The three bay west facade has a projecting two-by-one bay, two-story shed roof addition on the northwest. The addition has a 6/6 window on the second floor and an entrance on the first floor sheltered by a two-bay shed roof porch. The porch roof is supported on stripped log posts. There are two bays to the south of this addition, on the main structure.

There is a trailer immediately south of the building where the owners live. The old school is now used for storage. There is a grave to the northeast of the building, in a bank of trees and underbrush that run along a creek. The stone has been knocked over, but is quite legible. It reads "John Burke, died February 16, 1857, aged 67 years". There appears to be one other grave, but the stones are disordered and no other inscriptions were found.

Prepare both a summary paragraph of significance and a general statement of history and support.

The Old Baden School building is significant for its former use as a school and for its simple, vernacular architecture. The Baden School appears on the 1861 Martenet Map of Prince George's County, but not on the 1878 Hopkins Atlas of the County. There were two other schools in the area in 1878, one on Aquasco Road south of Horsehead and one to the east on the road to Magruder's Ferry.<sup>1</sup> This may have lead to the under-use and closing of the Baden School. The building and one acre lot were sold by the Board of County School Commissioners to Margaret J. Skinner in 1913.<sup>2</sup> Skinner is listed on the 1900 U.S. Census as the wife of Frederick K. Skinner, farmer.<sup>3</sup> It was probably after 1913 that the second story and north bay were added to the building.

The Baden School building was a one-room, one-story rectangular structure with a gable end entrance and without stylistic detail. When it was enlarged to be used as a residence its simple, utilitarian style was continued in the new additions. The large first story schoolroom was left undivided. The Baden School building is one of few such nineteenth century utilitarian structures to survive in the County.

The grave northeast of the school building is that of John Burke. Burke is listed on the 1850 U.S. Census as a planter and merchant, born in Ireland.<sup>4</sup> He and his wife resided close to the school from at least 1857 (the date of his death) through 1878, as Matilda Burke appears on both the 1861 and 1878 maps of the County. If the Burke residence is extant it has not yet been identified.




