Description

The Catherine Gardiner House is a two-story, gable-roof, rectangular frame structure on a hill west of Baden-Westwood Road. It is on an unwooded lot, surrounded by fields. There is a one-story gable roofed addition on the south end of the main structure. The five bay east (entrance) facade has central entrance through a six panel door flanked by two 9/6 double hung sash windows. The second story has five 6/6 windows. There is a simple boxed cornice. The house has a standing seam metal gable roof, and is covered with asphalt shingle, wood grained and painted white. There is a brick foundation. The south gable end has an exterior corbelled brick chimney. The first story is covered by the one-story, one-bay gable roofed addition, which has the same roof and wall covering as the main structure. There is rough horizontal wood siding showing through the shingle wall covering. The five-bay west (rear) facade has a central rear entrance altered to a 2/2 window. There is a cellar entrance in the foundation beneath the fourth bay. The house is supported on wooden piers. The hand-hewn sill is visible on the west facade where siding is missing. The north gable end has an interior corbelled chimney at the roof ridge. The facade is unfenestrated. There is a gable roofed corn crib with slatted sides to the west and a gable roof frame barn southeast of the house.

Significance

The Catherine G. Gardiner House was probably built in 1835 when Ignatius F. Gardiner acquired 522 acres of a tract called Anchovie Hills. Gardiner died in 1841, devising his estate to his wife Catherine. Catherine Gardiner was assessed in 1845 for an estate value of \$22,392, including slaves. She died in 1865, and devised her estate to her daughters. The daughters owned the property through 1903. The house appears on the 1861 Martenet Map of the County. It had two long term owners from 1903 to 1976, and is presently vacant. The Gardiner house is significant for the age of the structure and for its "I" house plan. Few frame "I" houses from the first half of the 19th century survive in the County. The house is in its original form, altered only by the addition of shingles over the original wood siding and a one-story south wing.

The Catherine Gardiner House is a two-story, gable-roof, rectangular frame structure. It is situated on a hill west of Baden-Westwood Road on an unwooded lot, surrounded by fields. There is a one-story gable roofed addition on the south end of the main structure.

The five bay east (entrance) facade has central entrance through a six panel door flanked by two 9/6 double hung sash windows. The second story has five 6/6 windows. The windows have narrow wood surrounds and wood sills. There is a simple boxed cornice. The house has a standing seam metal gable roof, and is covered with asphalt shingle which is wood grained and painted white. Horizontal wood siding shows through the shingle covering. There is a brick foundation.

The west (rear) facade also has five bays. The window and cornice treatment are the same as that on the front of the structure. A central rear entrance was altered to a 2/2 window. There is a cellar entrance in the foundation beneath the fourth bay. The cellar is dirt floored. The house is supported on wooden piers, visible in the cellar. The hand-hewn sill is visible on the west facade where the siding is missing.

The north gable end is unfenestrated. There is an interior corbelled chimney at the roof ridge.

The south gable end has an exterior corbelled brick chimney and no fenestration. The first story is covered by the one-story, one-bay gable roofed addition, which has the same roof and wall covering as the main structure. It had an east-facing window, which is now boarded over. It is supported on cement blocks. There is rough horizontal wood siding showing through the shingle wall covering. There is a small rectangular window in the south upper gable end.

There are two small gable roofed frame outbuildings west of the house which are in ruins. Farther west is a gable roofed corn crib with slatted sides. There is a large, gable roof frame barn southeast of the house.

The Catherine G. Gardiner House was probably built in 1835 after Ignatius F. Gardiner acquired 522 acres of several tracts including Anchovie Hills, Quick Sale, and others.¹ Gardiner died in 1841, devising his entire estate to his wife Catherine.² Catherine Gardiner was assessed in 1845 for real estate valued at \$14,320 and a total estate value of \$22,392, including slaves.³ She died in 1865, and devised her estate to her three daughters. The Gardiner daughters owned the 522 acre property through 1903.⁴

The house appears on the Martenet Map of the County. Its appearance places it at an earlier construction date, however. It had two long term owners from 1903 to 1976.⁵ It presently is standing vacant.

The Gardiner house is significant for the age of the structure and for its "I" house plan. Few frame "I" houses from the first half of the nineteenth century survive in the County (c.f. #87B-1). The house survives in its original form, altered only by the addition of shingles over the original wood siding and the small one-story south addition.

The house is a two-story, frame structure, built in several sections. The east end is two stories and had a three-bay facade and external end chimney. The entrance was in the west bay. The two west bays were added, with a small internal chimney at the west end, giving the house a central doorway. The first floor windows are 9/6 double hung sash. On the east end is a one-story wing.

In plan, the house has a central hall with flanking rooms. The staircase rises behind a board partition wall.

The house is covered with asbestos siding.






