**DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE**

At Walnut Grove Farm, the dwelling was built in the 1930's to replace an early 18th or even 17th century dwelling of which there remain several photos. Still standing and restored on the property is an early Quarters and spring house.

The Quarters is two bays wide and two bays deep and is a true one and one-half story structure. The building is covered with modern weatherboard and the windows have 6/6 sash and louvered shutters. Its interior is divided into two sections with exposed joists, girder, and partitions. The larger room has a fireplace. Possibly the first story was divided into four rooms originally, but at least three. To the rear is a shed addition which contains a kitchen, part of which is original.

On the second story are two rooms divided by board walls and having board ceilings. From a small vestibule the enclosed stair descends from the east corner to the large room below.

The existing spring house or dairy is brick, half sunk into the ground with modern bulkhead to the floor. There is a stair to the upper section of the structure as well.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

Walnut Grove has one of the few early Quarters remaining in Talbot, others being at Wilderness and Lee Haven. It is a significant site of an early dwelling of which several photos are in existence, including one published by H.C. Forman in 1934.

West of the dwelling is a graveyard bearing the stones of members of the Martin, Clayland, Lloyd and Stevens families. The range in date is from 1794 to 1912.




