The P. Maddox House stands at the end of Hall's Creek Road and is surrounded by tidal marsh. The third quarter of the 19th-century side hall/parlor frame house rests on a brick pier foundation and is trimmed with bracketed eaves. Similar to many houses from the period, the brick chimney rises against the hall partition and is finished with a corbelled cap.

Although the Maddox family appears in a chain of title from 1871 to 1874, John T. Parks purchased the creek property in 1874.

The "P. Maddox House" stands at the end of Hall's Creek Road and is surrounded by tidal marsh. The nearest town is Upper Fairmount, and Maryland 361 passes one mile north of the structure.

The c. 1860-1870 two-story side hall/parlor frame house rests on a brick pier foundation and is sheathed with weatherboards. A medium sloped asphalt tile roof covers the structure. A dentiled and bracketed eave extends around the main block, but the two-story kitchen wing is embellished only with plain brackets.

The south facade is three bays across with a four-panel door occupying the left bay. A five-light transom and three-light sidelights surround the entrance. Six over six sash occupy the remaining openings. A brick chimney rises between the hall and the parlor and is finished with a corbelled cap.

The east and west gable ends have single six over six sash on each floor.

The two-story service wing is four bays across by one-room deep with a combination of door and window openings on the first floor and four window openings to each side of the wing on the second floor. An exterior brick chimney rises against the north gable end.

The interior was not entered but obviously was finished with c. 1860 woodwork.

Surrounding the house is a broad marsh, and Hall's Creek is located directly east.

P. Maddox - 1877

The P. Maddox House is a significant mid 19th-century survival of a side hall/parlor frame house with bracketed eaves. Like many houses from the period, the brick chimney rises against the hall partition and is finished with a corbelled cap.

Although the Maddox family appears in a chain of title from 1871 to 1874, John T. Parks purchased the Hall's Creek property in 1874. Evidently, Parks rented the house to the presently unidentified P. Maddox in 1877, since it is P. Maddox who is located on the County atlas map.

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
