H.C. Tull House  
Upper Fairmount

Supported by a raised common bond brick foundation, this two-story hip roofed house stands out as one of the older and more distinctive houses in the village of Upper Fairmount. The center hall main house was heated by twin brick chimneys which rise from the rear wall. Extending to the south is a two-story service wing. Also located on the property is a pyramidal roofed outbuilding trimmed with paneled pilasters.

An exact year of construction has not been established, but architectural details comfortably date it to the third quarter of the nineteenth century. The dwelling is designated on the 1877 county atlas under the name of H.C. Tull, who was the proprietor of his adjacent store, listed under the name of H.C. Tull and Company.
