Campoe Farm is situated on the north side of US 13 approximately .50 of a mile west of the Green Hill crossroads. This two-story side hall/parlor frame house is a moderately significant third quarter of the 19th-century example of a county farmhouse with unusual corbelled brick chimneys. Both the interior and exterior have been remodeled with the survival of some period mantels and woodwork. The two-story tower that rises on the front corner was a slightly later, c. 1890-1910 addition.

Campoe Farm is situated on the north side of US 13 approximately .75 of a mile west of the Green Hill crossroads. The two-story side hall/ parlor frame house faces south with the gable running east/west. The nearest town is Westover, Somerset County, Maryland.

The c. 1860-1870 two-story two-bay house is supported by a minimal brick foundation and is uniformly sheathed with asbestos siding. The medium pitched roof is covered with asphalt shingles, and it has extended eaves. A two-story two-bay ell service wing extends to the rear while a single-story kitchen is attached to it.

The south (main) elevation is two bays across with an entrance in the right (or east) bay. The front door is partially glazed. Single-pane sash windows light the first and second floors. According to the present owners, the corner two-story bay was attached after initial construction. The first floor is covered by a hip roof porch with chamfered posts.

The west gable end is dominated by an exterior common bond brick stack with corbelled c. The two-story two-bay rear ell is presently used as the dining room on the first floor. The exterior details are largely the same aside from the 6/6 sash windows that survive. An identical brick chimney rises against the north wall of the dining room section and is covered on the first floor by the single-story kitchen addition.

The interior of this house has been largely remodeled, but some third quarter of the 19th-century woodwork survives. A few four-panel doors and a plain mid 19th century mantel remain in the front rooms.


