Sited on high ground on the northwest side of the Pocomoke River, the Fleury house is a two-story, side hall parlor frame house that was enlarged during the third quarter of the nineteenth century by a two-story, two-bay gable end addition. Even though the house has been moderately remodeled, some of the late Federal period woodwork survives intact. Stretching eastward from the house site are expansive views of the tidal marsh of Worcester County dotted with cyprus trees.

Prepare both a summary paragraph and a general description of the resource and its various elements as it exists today.

The Fleury Property is located on the east side of MD 667 between the state road and the Pocomoke River. The two-story early 19th-century house stands at the end of a dirt farm lane which intersects MD 667, near the old road which leads to Rehobeth, Somerset County, Maryland. The house faces west with the main roof running on a north/south axis.

The two-story c. 1830-1840 five-bay frame house rests on a minimal brick pier foundation and is sheathed uniformly with aluminum siding. A layer of asphalt shingles covers the medium sloped roof. The gable ends are flush with interior end brick stacks.

The west (main) facade is an uneven five-bay elevation that indicates the northern three bays were erected initially. The southern two-bay section appears to be a mid-19th-century addition. Centered in the main elevation is a front door which is covered by a shed roof enclosed porch. The first and second floors are lighted by 3/1 sash windows, and a simple boxed cornice runs across the base of the roof.

The gable end elevations are plain aluminum-sided walls with louvered vents flanking the interior end stacks.

Extending from the rear (east) elevation is a modern two-story two-bay kitchen wing, also covered with aluminum siding and topped by a medium pitched asphalt roof. A single-story wing is attached to the east gable of the kitchen wing.

Although a full interior inspection was not made on the first visit, it was apparent the oldest portion (north half of main house) dates to the second quarter of the 19th century. Period mantels and woodwork date from this period.

The Fleury property is a remodeled early 19th-century farmhouse that stands on the west bank of the Pocomoke River. Stretching eastward are expansive views of tidal saltmarsh of Worcester County. The initial side hall/parlor house was enlarged in the third quarter of the century by the addition of a two-story one-room plan structure. Some of the period woodwork survives intact despite the modern alterations.


