Nineteenth century

The Tull family cemetery is located on the west side of a dirt lane and due east of East Creek near Tulls Corner. Approximately a dozen markers are surrounded by a cast iron fence, approximately thirty feet across and twenty feet deep. Small fleur-de-lis shaped points are framed by round iron arches. The cemetery gate is on the east side, and it is marked by a Tull family name plate. The gate also carries the iron maker's plack in the shape of a shield. The fence was made by Stewart Iron Works of Cincinnati, Ohio. Among the numerous mid to late nineteenth-century markers are the table stones of Samuel Tull (1773-1826) and his wife, Caroline Tull (1788-1835). Samuel L. Tull (1826-1906) and his wife, M. Catherine Tull (1834-1877) are also buried in this cemetery. Catherine Tull's ^{gravestone} is signed by a maker's name: Huston, Salisbury.

The Tull Cemetery is located on the west side of an unnamed dirt road due east of East Creek near Tulls Corner, Somerset County, Maryland. Approximately a dozen markers are surrounded by a cast iron fence, approximately thirty feet across and twenty feet deep. Small fleur-de-lis shaped points are framed by a rounded iron arch. The cemetery gate is located in the east side and is distinguished by the Tull family nameplate and a maker's name plack in tffe shape of a shield. The fence was made by Stewart Iron Works of Cincinnati, Ohio. Among the numerous mid to late 19th-century markers are two table stones of Samuel Tull (1773-1826) and his wife, Caroline Tull (1788-1835). Samuel L. Tull (6/29/1826-2/25/1906) and his wife, M. Catherine Tull (1834-1877) are also buried in this cemetery. Catherine Tull's marker is signed "Huston,Salisbury."



