The Williams-Coleman house, a two-story, two-bay frame dwelling, stands on the north side of Jones Factory Road in the vicinity of Upper Hill, Somerset County, Maryland. Built around 1890-1910, the main side hall/parlor front block extends to the rear with a single-story kitchen wing. The house stands in a row of contemporary late nineteenth century dwelling that line Jones Factory Road, named for the former canning company that operated in the community between 1908 and when the business was relocated in 1925 to a site near Pocomoke City.

The Williams-Coleman house contributes to the late nineteenth century appearance of the Upper Hill community.

The Williams-Coleman house stands at 27940 Jones Factory Road in the vicinity of Upper Fairmount, Somerset County, Maryland. The two-story, two-bay frame house faces south with the gable roof oriented on an east/west axis.

Erected around 1890-1910, this two-story side hall/parlor frame dwelling is supported on a low masonry foundation, and the house is sheathed with a layer of vinyl siding. The medium pitched gable roof is covered with asphalt shingles. Attached to the back of the single-pile main block is a single story kitchen wing.

The south (main) elevation is a two-bay facade with an enclosed porch sheltering the first floor side entrance. The second floor is pierced by a pair of single-pane sash windows flanked by vinyl shutters. The base of the roof is finished with a boxed cornice.

The east gable end is marked by a pair of single-pane sash windows on each floor, which flanked an interior end brick stove flue. The eaves to the roof are slightly extended. The west gable end, on the other hand, is marked by a single window on each floor.

Attached to the back of the main block is a single-story kitchen wing served by an interior end brick stove chimney.

The interior was not seen.

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
