DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

Waverly is located on Edmondson Neck south of Easton on the Tred Avon River. It was originally a farm house for all of the surrounding area which is now developed.

The house is composed of a tall two and one-half story, two bay section with two story, two bay wing on the northwest. A one story garage is built on the southeast and a one and one-half story section on the northeast. The original house consisted of the tall section which appears to retain original beaded siding. Its southwest facade is the principal entrance with side door and single window on the first story and two windows on the second story and attic. There is a brick chimney within the gable. Although it has two windows on its gable, it is only one room deep.

The northeast wing was probably the original kitchen, but it has been remodeled into a dining room and a kitchen was added thereto. Its northwest wing was originally built onto the facade of the building but it was moved to its present location in this century.

Its original interior was composed of a stair hall and living room and probably had two windows flanking the fireplace before the wing was added. It appears to have been built in the first quarter of the nineteenth century. The two story wing appears to have been constructed in the second quarter of the century.
